**Tom Simon and Woody Jones, our Co-Big Fish, are working on details for possible fish fry activities, so stay tuned for more on that as well.**

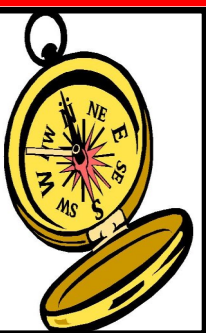

# Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to the proper procedure for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail still works perfectly well also. Those liking immediate gratification may use the instructions below for a small processing fee.

Brothers,

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2021 are \$40.

Our council website [www.kc11402.org](http://www.kc11402.org) handles electronic payment of council dues.

You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.75 (which includes a \$1.75 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently.

You may still pay your normal 2021 annual dues directly at a meeting or send a check made out to "**KofC Council 11402**" to:

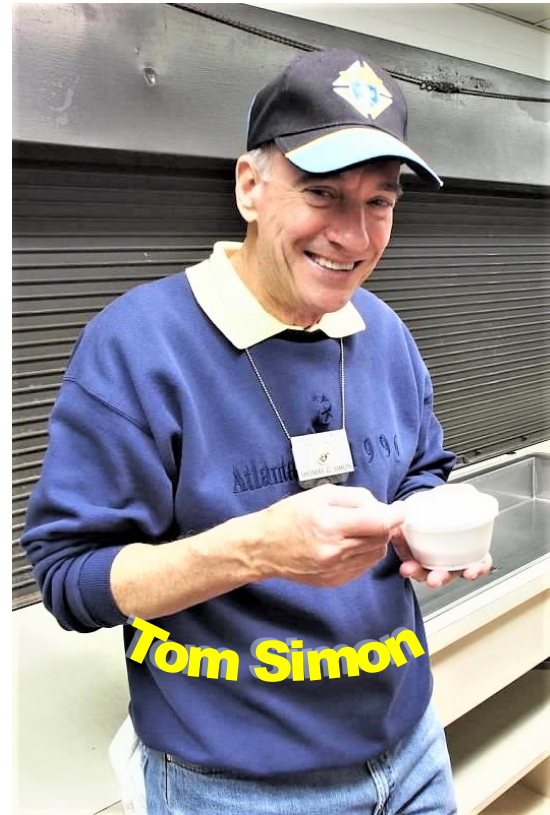

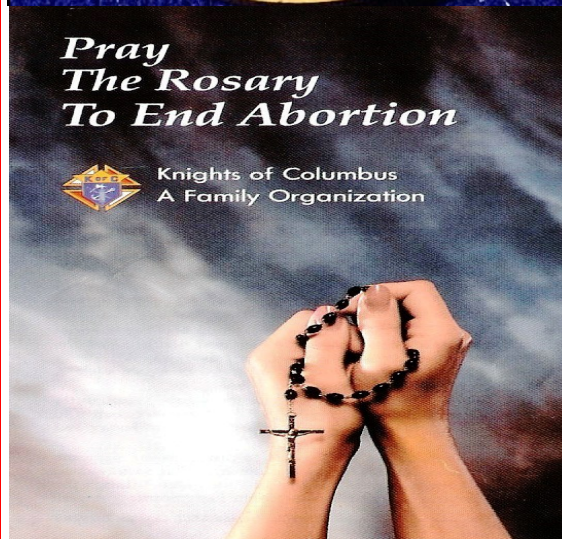

He went on to found St. Brigid Council and serve as Georgia State Deputy as well. We re-publish this piece of KofC history. - WHEREAS:** Sir Knight Richard G. Sisko served as Grand Knight of Council 11402, earning Star Council twice, and Faithful Navigator of Assembly 2688, and
- WHEREAS:** Under the leadership of Grand Knight Richard G. Sisko, Council 11402 was awarded the Order's International Service Program Award in the Church category, and
- WHEREAS:** Sir Knight Richard G. Sisko received the William T. Jordan Jr. Memorial Award for outstanding District Deputy in the Archdiocese of Atlanta for the years 2002, 2004, and 2005, and
- WHEREAS:** Sir Knight Richard G. Sisko served on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree team for the State of Georgia, Council Degree teams, and the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree team for the Desoto Province, District of Georgia, and
- WHEREAS:** Brother Richard Sisko served this nation honorably as a Soldier in the United States Army from 1964 to 1967, and his community on the Board of Directors of the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at the University of Alabama in Huntsville, and
- WHEREAS:** Sir Knight Richard G. Sisko served the parish of St. Brigid as an Eucharistic Minister, was a founding member of St. Brigid Council 13204 in Johns Creek, Georgia and served in the Charles J. Waters Assembly 2688 in Dunwoody, Georgia, and
- WHEREAS:** Sir Knight Richard G. Sisko was the loving father of Richard and Kimberly, doting grandfather of 2 grandchildren. Brother Sisko passed from this life to his Eternal Reward since this body last met, therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That the Georgia State Council of the Knights of Columbus joins the entire Order in mourning the passing of Past State Deputy Richard G. Sisko and in thanking God for the gift of his spiritual leadership as State Deputy, Brother Knight, and friend and therefore be it

Jeanette Leah "Jean" Palicia, Stoneboro, PA, passed away peacefully at 11:30 PM. Saturday, June 26, 2021 in Allegheny General Hospital. She was 81.

Born December 22, 1939 in Linglestown, PA to Charles W. and Evelyn B. Baugher Reagle, Sr.

Jean was a 1957 graduate of Lakeview High School and married Zachary R. Palicia April 4, 1959. While he was active with the US Air Force, she worked many places where he was stationed including a bar maid at a bowling alley and assistant manager of an apartment complex in Virginia, then a volunteer elementary school clinic aide and religious education teacher, Patrick AFB and Catholic religious program coordinator High Wycombe Air Station, England. Upon returning home she worked at the New Lebanon Dairy Isle, H & R Block and retired from Lakeview Schools as part of the janitorial staff for many years.

Jean was preceded in death by a sister Shirley Reagle and a brother Charles W. Reagle, Jr.

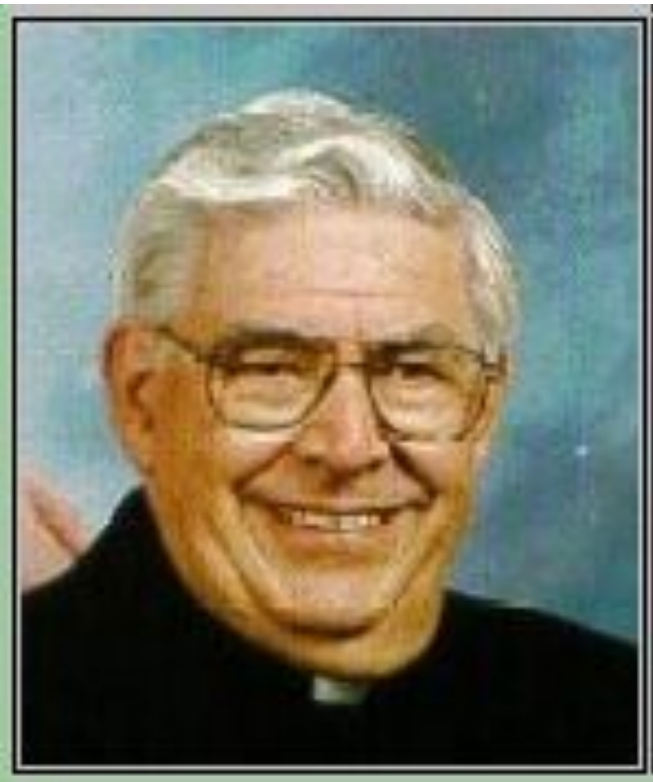
# Deacon Raymond Egan Has Passed

Just about two years after wife Betty-Lee Egan passed, our beloved Sir Knight Deacon Raymond F. Egan, 86, passed away from cancer in home hospice on November 6, 2021. He was a long time member of the Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly as well.

Ray was a founding member of All Saints Council 11402 in 1994, although he and Betty-Lee transferred their church affiliation to Saint Jude the Apostle Parish, where he served the last few years of his deacon service. He had served as Deacon many years at All Saints as well, while she sang in the choir and was notable in church fish fries.

Egan had also served as the Director of Catholic Cemeteries for the Atlanta Archdiocese, and was instrumental in bringing back the oldest Catholic cemetery in Sparta, Georgia from overgrown bramble vegetation. He celebrated his 30th anniversary as a deacon last year and had been married to Betty-Lee for over 62 years. They were named the All Saints Family of the Year in 2012.

He had had successful careers as both a fireman and a policeman before becoming a deacon. He was also the “pastor” of the Hartsfield Atlanta Airport Chapel for some years as well. He even served as Chaplain of the Dunwoody Police Department. Deacon Ray will be missed.



# **Longtime Dunwoody Police Chaplain Remembered for ‘huge heart’ — Deacon Ray Egan**

**DUNWOODY, Ga. —** An excerpt from Ecclesiastes 3:4 in the Bible reads, “There’s a time to laugh, a time to dance and a time to die. “And I’m OK with that,” the Rev. Raymond Francis Egan used to say. “I really am. I have had such a full and wonderful life. God bless each one of you.”

Egan, 86, of Dunwoody, died Nov. 6. A native of Hartford, Connecticut, he was affectionately known as “Deacon Ray.” He served 11 years in the National Guard, and in Windsor Locks, Connecticut, he served 20 years as a police officer and firefighter. Before his death, he celebrated 30 years as a deacon.

In 1977, Egan and his wife Betty-Lee became one of the founding families of All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody. The church was established as a mission of St. Jude the Apostle Church in Sandy Springs, where Egan ultimately spent the last six years.

According to All Saints Catholic Church, the founders of the church rallied their resources, followed their Pastor Rev. Joseph Beltran’s vision and pitched in to build the current facilities. In less than two years, they were able to celebrate mass for the first time on Mount Vernon Road, with more than 300 families registered.

“When the construction for All Saints Catholic Church was completed in 1979,” it states, “the Dunwoody area was still primarily farms and rural areas without the subdivision growth of the last 40 years. In fact, ... the population of Dunwoody was 18,000.”

After helping establish the church, Egan continued to serve the community. He was ordained in June 1991. Then in 2010, the Dunwoody Police Department hosted a meeting of local ministries, priests and rabbis to see if there was interest in starting a police chaplain program.

The group thought the idea had merit, and Sgt. Mike Carlson was tasked with managing the Dunwoody Police Chaplain program. Carlson spent the remainder of 2010 and the beginning of 2011 organizing, designing and advertising the program. Egan was one of five chaplains who volunteered to get involved.

As a chaplain, Egan worked with department personnel by making themselves immediately available to assist in times of loss, confusion, depression or grief to people in crises. This service continues to not only be provided to the community but also all department employees and their families.

In a Facebook post Nov. 9, Dunwoody police said Egan was someone who loved helping others and had a personality larger than life. He was known as “Deke” around the department.

“He was a close friend to many of our staff and was always eager and present for duty calls as well as our celebrations and milestones,” the department wrote. “Thank you, sir, for your service and your huge, kind heart. You will forever be a loving legacy of our Dunwoody Blue Family. We’ll take it from here, sir.”



**Dunwoody Councilman John Heneghan said although he didn't know Egan personally, he knew he was passionate about serving those in need, especially police officers.**

**"Such a great guy and really relished serving as a DPD Police Chaplain," Heneghan said. Egan also served as archdiocesan liaison to the Korean Church of Atlanta, where he traveled to Korea to further develop the archdiocese of Atlanta's relationship with the dioceses in Korea. Later, Egan served as the director for the Office of Catholic Cemeteries in the archdiocese, which included overseeing the restoration of historic rural Catholic cemeteries.**

**Egan spent a lot of time in the airport ministry at Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport. The Interfaith Chapel, made possible by Atlanta religious leaders, serves the tens of thousands of airport workers as well as providing the millions who fly through Atlanta with a quiet space to reflect.**

**It is funded by the nonprofit Interfaith Airport Chaplaincy. In a 2012 article in the Georgia Bulletin, Egan called it the largest unofficial parish in the archdiocese. Dunwoody Homeowners Association President Bob Fiscella described Egan as "exceedingly community involved."**

**"It didn't matter your religion," Fiscella said. "He was always there to lend a helping hand. At his funeral, which was attended by all three bishops from the Archdiocese of Atlanta, Archbishop Gregory John Hartmayer said it best. He said, 'Ray could be a little crusty.' And Ray was a little crusty, but that only meant that he cared."**

**Fiscella said the two met at All Saints Catholic Church in 1993 when he got married and Egan offered some guidance to him and his wife. In recent years, they would get together about once a month to eat lunch. Fiscella said one of his favorite restaurants was Vintage Pizzeria on Chamblee Dunwoody Road.**

**"Even though it was typically just Ray and me, I knew before the end of the lunch we would be joined by someone that just happened to be there who Ray knew or be visited by at least a half-dozen folks who just wanted to say hi to Ray," Fiscella said. And, he said, Egan "loved to hold court."**

**"A favorite venue of his for doing this was the lunch area at Costco over a hot dog and a Coke," Fiscella said. "And it didn't take long before he had an audience."**

**Fiscella said an estimated 600 people attended Egan's funeral Nov. 12 at St. Jude the Apostle Catholic Church. He was laid to rest at Arlington Memorial Park in Sandy Springs.**

# In Memoriam

As we delve into the 2021 year, we remember the extraordinary number of All Saints brothers who have passed since the 2019 holiday season. We've lost **28** brothers since the year-end 2019 holiday season. We also lost 22 family members in three years.

In 2019, we almost made it through the entire year without the death of a council brother. Then, we had three consecutive holiday deaths just before the end of 2019.

In 2020, we were not so fortunate. All Saints lost a total of nine brothers, setting a sad yearly record for the council since its founding in 1994. Now 2021 has exceeded that sad record.

What often goes unnoticed are the significant numbers of children, wives, and widows of the council who passed in 2019, 2020, and 2021. This neared the number of brothers passing.

**Now 2021 has started sadly with Sixteen consecutive member deaths.**

Please make it a practice to keep in your prayers, our sick and deceased men and women of Council 11402. Note that all the 2020 deceased members and family were remembered at the State Convention Mass this past May. The 2021 deceased people will be remembered next year at the GA Convention.

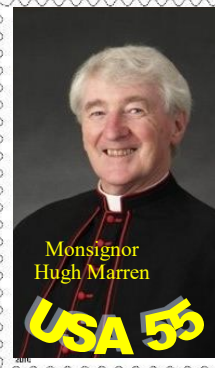
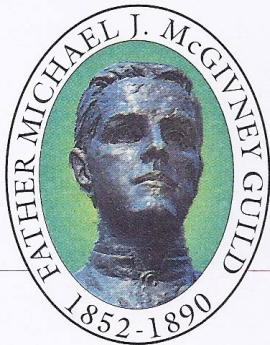
