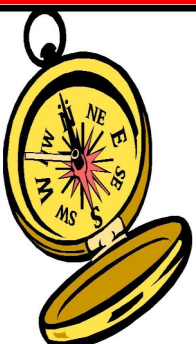

Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to the proper procedure for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail or paying at a council meeting still works perfectly well also. Those liking immediate gratification may use the instructions below for a small processing fee.

Brothers,

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2022 are \$40.

Our council website www.kc11402.org handles electronic payment of council dues as well.

You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.75 (which includes a \$1.75 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently at web site Paypal.com.

You may still pay your normal 2022 annual dues directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "**KofC Council 11402**" to:

Bingo Update—Back on Track



Sir Knight Dominic Palermo and his fabulous team have managed to restart our parish Bingo events after a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic. They had to start from scratch with parish scheduling, city permissions, state licensing, security, inventory, advertising, and lots of little nits before proceeding on May 26th.

They had no idea if anyone would show up, since the event interest could have been broken by the long lapse. Based on inflationary pressures in those two years and experience from past food pricing donations, a minimal price increase was warranted. Would this affect future attendance?

The team was pleasantly surprised (actually shocked) when the first two Bingo events brought in over 170 players. This was near the absolute attendance limit of the parish Social Hall. The net profit for council charities broke previous average totals from past years, although the winning amounts from individual games and raffle tickets is being increased to ensure future participation.

All this and Dominic had time to get a full knee replacement.

The council has since voted to fund the entry fee for our council widows as we do at our Fish Frys.

We hope that our members and spouses participate in this valuable community fun event on the fourth Thursday of every month, except when Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday periods necessitate a one week rescheduling.

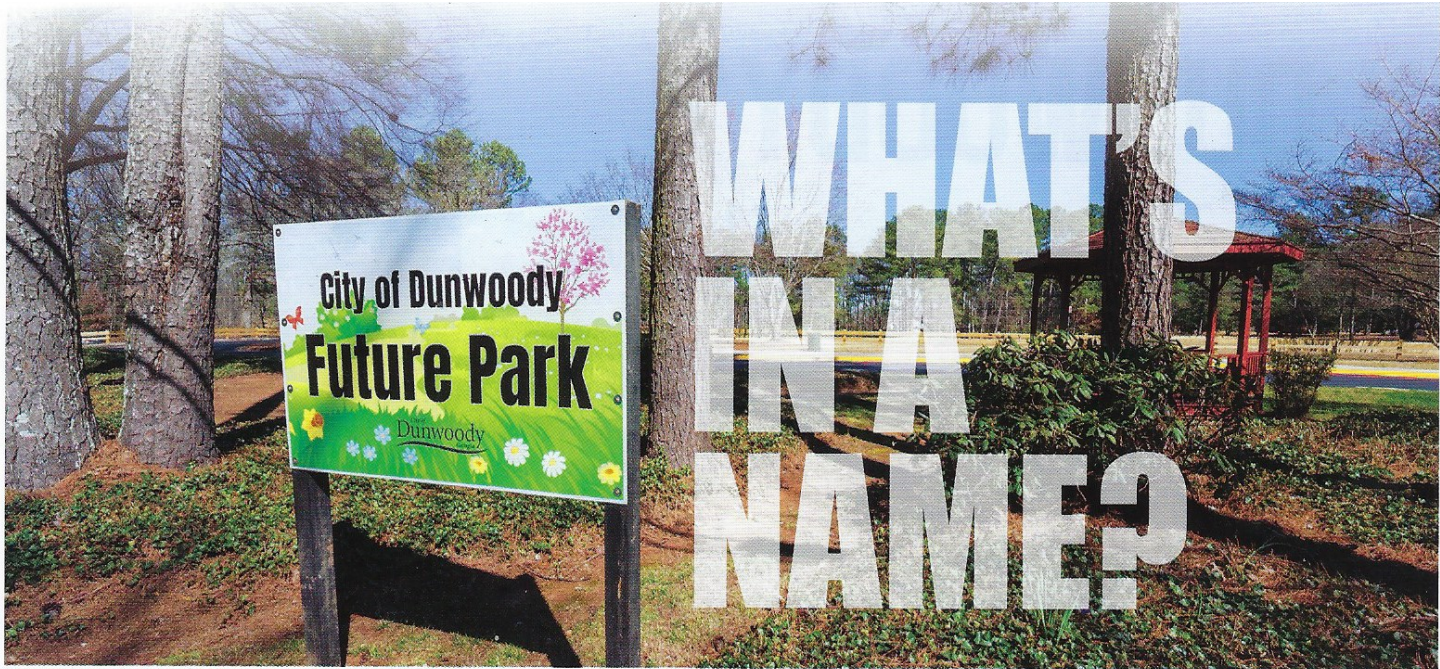
New Dunwoody Park Naming

The City of Dunwoody has three new parks that are not yet named. They are looking for nomination emails. The rules are shown below. Strangely enough, the rules do not seem to limit nominations to Dunwoody residents. The new Vermack Road Park is nearest All Saints, but others are not far.

The nominee must be deceased at least five years, but this requirement can be waived by the city.

If you can think of a worthy citizen, religious person, or politician who provided exceptional service to the community and is worthy of such recognition, please email to parcs@dunwoodyga.gov with your reasoning. This article appeared in the *Dunwoody Digest* July-September 2022 issue.

Each email must be from an interested citizen who nominates one person for one park and is not writing in the interests of an organization.



Dunwoody's Parks and Recreation team is looking for your ideas for names for three future park properties. The parks are located on Perimeter Center East, Roberts Drive, and Vermack Road. But before you start brainstorming, you'll want to be aware of the city policy for the naming of city parks, recreational areas, streets, roads, and facilities.

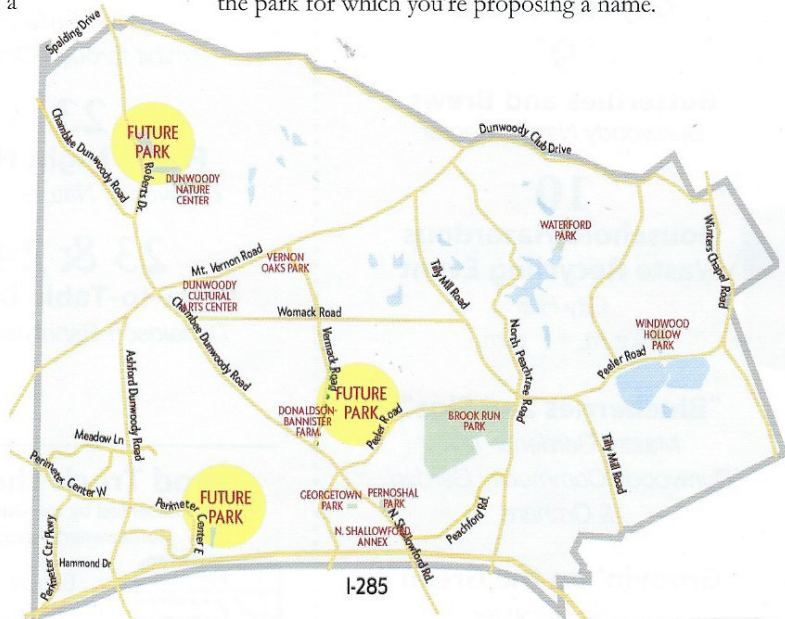
The policy is designed to guide name recognition and establish a uniform application.

Under the policy, names should enhance the sense of community and ensure that parks are easily identified and located. Public participation and input are also encouraged in the naming policy.

Here are additional considerations for names:

- Geographic location
- An outstanding feature of the area
- Commonly recognized subjects of historical significance such as event, person, group, culture, or place
- A person or group that significantly contributed to the acquisition or development of the park or facility
- An individual who provided exceptional service in the interest of the city or community
- If naming after a person, that person must be deceased for a minimum of five years, but the Mayor and Council can make an exception and waive the time requirement

This is where you come in. We invite you to email your ideas to parcs@dunwoodyga.gov. Parks and Rec will consider all ideas and create a list of top choices to present to the City Manager. The City Manager will then make a recommendation to the Mayor and City Council for final naming decisions. There is no specific timeline, but don't delay. We want to hear your great ideas. And be sure to specify the park for which you're proposing a name.

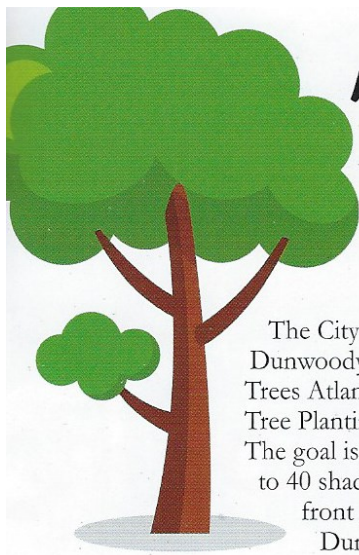


Order a Dunwoody Tree

Trees Atlanta and The City of Dunwoody wish to plant 40 new shade trees in Dunwoody front yards. They have opened up a registration campaign starting August 1st for residents to email their requests. First come, first served.

At that time, email for your online application which will be available on www.dunwoodyga.gov/frontyardtree. There is no cost to this program.

The City of Dunwoody is joining the Trees Atlanta Front Yard Tree Planting Program. The goal is to plant up to 40 shade trees in front yards across Dunwoody.

“This is a great program to further our goal of protecting and building up Dunwoody’s tree canopy,” said Dunwoody Community Development Director Richard McLeod. “This will also give residents a greater sense of ownership in Dunwoody’s urban forest.”

Trees Atlanta, a nonprofit organization committed to the care and replenishment of metro Atlanta’s urban forest, will manage the processing of tree requests and coordinate with homeowners for the selection, placement, and installation of up to two front yard trees per home through this program.

“Since starting the front yard tree program in 2017, we’ve placed more than 2,000 trees in front yards across metro Atlanta,” explained Judy Yi, director of marketing for Trees Atlanta. “We appreciate the City of Dunwoody for expanding its efforts to protect and plant trees through the Front Yard Tree program.”

In April, the Dunwoody City Council voted to commit \$10,000 to the program, so there is no cost to property owners. Planting will begin in October 2022 and continue through March 2023, if necessary.

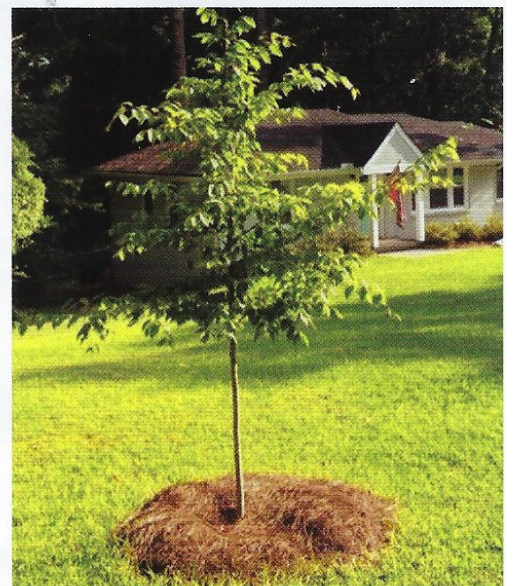
The new trees must be planted on private property within 35 feet of a right-of-way.



Front yard locations allow mature trees to provide shade onto public areas. After planting, property owners shall be responsible for watering and maintaining the new trees.

“Trees are good for the environment, help prevent erosion and beautify our community,” said Dunwoody Mayor Lynn Deutsch. “I look forward to seeing the benefits of this partnership grow.”

Dunwoody property owners interested in being part of the program must submit an online application, which will be available starting August 1 via www.dunwoodyga.gov/frontyardtree. Trees will be allotted on a first-come, first-served basis.

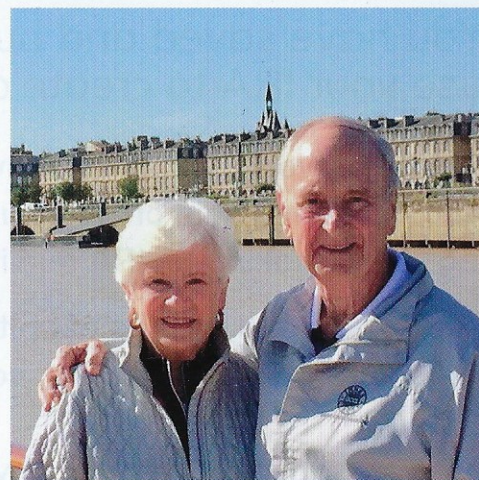
Endowing Catholic Education

Marie Crean has used many methods to support charitable organizations. "Giving to my favorite charities from my IRA is a tax-free way to give from IRA taxable income," she shared. She's also given gifts of cash. Last year, she decided to use a charitable fund to establish the Crean Family Fund, an endowment fund which will provide scholarships for students in need to attend Marist School and Reach for Excellence.

Her four children and three of her grandchildren attended Marist School in Brookhaven. She and her late husband, Dennis, had supported a program called LINK in Chicago and were pleased to support Reach for Excellence when they learned of it after living in Atlanta for several years. Reach for Excellence is a Marist sponsored nonprofit that offers students of limited income a mix of academic, cultural, and community-based experiences that prepares them for the challenges of college-preparatory programs. "Dennis and I were both Catholic educated and see the difference a faith-based education can provide in forming the whole person," Marie said.

She chose to set up an endowment fund for these two organizations because it will continue to support their missions forever. "I'm so pleased that Marie chose to place her fund at the Catholic Foundation because I know how much her Catholic faith means to her and she knows that we will honor her intent in perpetuity," said Catholic Foundation President Nancy Coveny.

Gray Plunkett African June Newsletter

Our Sir Knight Gray Plunkett travels every year to Benin Africa to translate the Bible into the local Foodo language.



Dear Friends,

While it took me three attempts over a span of two days to depart from Atlanta (a long, but fascinating story), I managed to fly from Newark to Lomé, Togo on May 17th, arriving in Lomé on Wednesday the 18th at noon local time. I traveled part way to the north of Togo that day.

On Thursday, I stopped in the town of Kara to extend my Togo visa for one year and to visit colleagues at the SIL Center there. I then continued my journey, crossing the newly, officially-opened Togolese border, entering Benin with no problems. (Togo closed its borders at the start of the Pandemic in 2020, but Benin never closed their land borders.) By 3:30 PM I made it safely to my home in Sèmèrè.

I am thankful to God for safe travels and grateful that I found everyone in my neighborhood to be doing well. I apologize that I did not manage to send out a newsletter before my departure, but I appreciate the prayers of those of you who knew my plans.

I will be here until September 19th, when I will need to travel back to Lomé for my flight to the USA on the 21st. During my time here I plan to work with the Foodo language team to finish up two of the projects we had started last year.

I will also be attending a workshop at the end of August (along with one member of the team) to set up a website for Foodo language development. Please pray that God would keep us focused on the work we have to accomplish in the next four months.

I am grateful to all of you that continue to give generously to this work among the Foodo people. Please pray that God would provide for all the needs of the Foodo language project.

I hope to write another letter in July with more details of how the work is progressing.

New Council Visiting Ministry Formed

Sir Knight Gene Gannon has seen the need for a council ministry in which brothers take turns visiting our sick and ailing brothers. It is no secret that our council has dozens and dozens of members hospitalized or homebound. Here is Gene's personal view of how this ministry would work. He is already recruiting volunteers. Here is his comment:

"I have developed a team of 23 Knights who will do visits for our fellow Knights (two Knights at each visit) who have debilitating illnesses. This all came to light with several brothers coming down with Alzheimer's disease.

This ministry will expand as a number of our member Knights are developing other medical issues. The visits can go from one to two hours a week or every two weeks. The rotation would consist of a Knight doing one visit every 4-6 weeks. I will be reaching out to recruit more Knights for this ministry shortly. I thank the Knights who have pledged their support on this endeavor!" Contact Gene Gannon to volunteer at **gene_gannon@bellsouth.net** (note the underscore)".

Brother Tom Simon had graciously suggested that this new visiting ministry could be folded into his existing "I Care" medical driving ministry, but it is not a very comfortable fit. Drivers are not needed for a volunteer trip to county medical centers, and I Care is intended for all DeKalb residents needing travel assistance. It is not a pure council endeavor and has its own list of driver volunteers. We thank him for his consideration. This ministry is more of an "I Visit", while plagiarizing his ministry's name.

Gene would love to get his growing list of volunteers up to maybe 40 in number. Please considerer spending an hour or two with a hospitalized or homebound brother or possibly even a brother's incapacitated wife.

Our Past Grand Knight, Lou Hlad, was delighted to learn that his younger brother, Frank Hlad, has just been elected Grand Knight of Gilmore Council #310 in Cleveland Ohio. Gilmore has 350 members.

Supreme Knight on Roe v. Wade Decision

My Brother Knights:

After nearly 50 years, the wrong decision that was made in *Roe v. Wade* has been set right. The Supreme Court's historic decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* overturning both *Roe* and *Planned Parenthood v. Casey*, is a watershed moment in the movement that generations of Knights of Columbus have worked and prayed for. Indeed, it is one of the most significant advancements in human rights in our nation's history.

We are grateful and encouraged by the Court's finding that abortion is not a "constitutional right." But we must not think that today is a day to declare victory. Instead, I call upon every member of the Knights of Columbus to redouble their personal efforts to build up the Culture of Life that St. John Paul II described in his prophetic encyclical letter *Evangelium Vitae*.

With *Roe* reversed, federal advocacy to protect unborn life is still necessary, but the decision opens wide the doors for states to consider their own abortion laws as well. Many states have laws that immediately protect unborn human life. Others have taken regrettable steps to make themselves "sanctuaries" for abortion-on-demand. Pregnancy resources centers will become even more vital as they reach out to serve pregnant women, new mothers and their children.

In the months and years ahead, Knights should work to support — or start — marches for life in every state. Another critical action we can all take is to increase our support for pregnancy resource centers in our communities.

To that end, the Supreme Council has announced a \$5 million campaign to support new mothers and their children through a new program: ASAP (Aid and Support After Pregnancy). These pregnancy centers and maternity homes are now the front lines of the pro-life movement, and Knights should continue to stand and serve with them. You can support this effort by making a donation today.

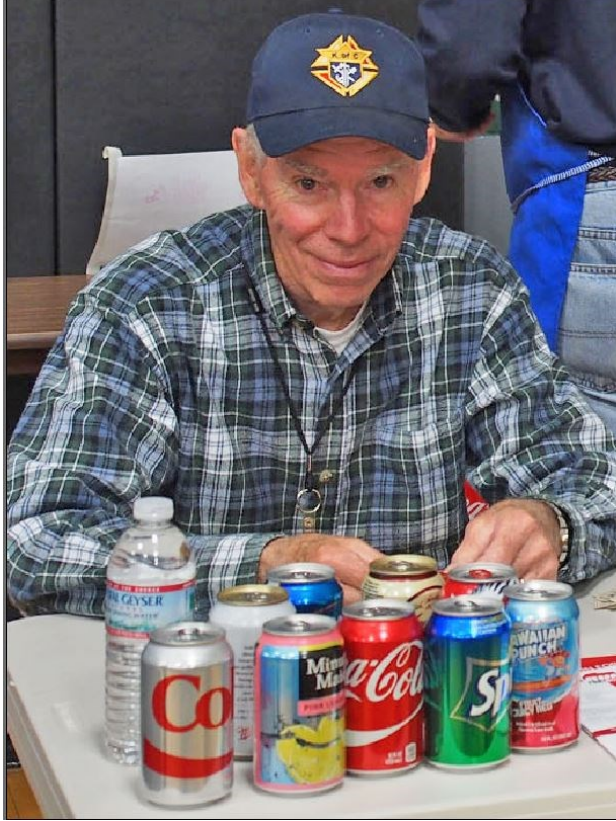


Prayer to End Abortion


In Memoriam

John Richard Brach
August 18, 1941 – May 28, 2022

John Richard Brach, 80, of Dunwoody, GA, passed away on May 28 after a brief illness surrounded by his loving family. He was born in Rockville Center, NY on August 18, 1941 to the late Walter John Brach and Yvonne LeClair Brach. He grew up in Lynbrook, NY, and graduated from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) with a bachelor's and master's degree in civil engineering. After graduating he served in the U.S. Army in the Army Corps of Engineers at Ft. Belvoir where he taught construction management. During this time he met his beloved wife, Donna, to whom he was married for 54 years.

Early in his career John worked on the transit systems in Boston and Washington, D.C. before moving to Atlanta in 1974 to help develop a brand-new subway line. He spent the majority of his career as a project engineer and later as Director of Engineering at Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) before retiring in 1998.

In his retirement John continued to consult for engineering firms and taught project management courses throughout the country. He enjoyed numerous hobbies including woodworking and other projects in his basement workshop. He loved all things

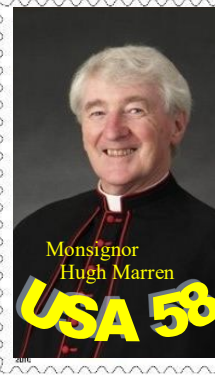
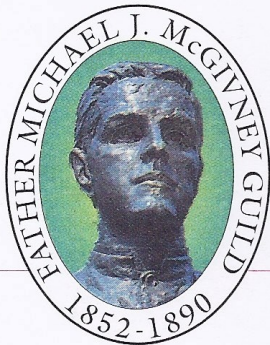
