Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to the proper procedure for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail or paying at a council meeting still works perfectly well also. Those liking immediate gratification may use the instructions below for a small processing fee.

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2022 are \$40.

Our council website <u>www.kc11402.org</u> handles electronic payment of council dues as well.

You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.75 (which includes a \$1.75 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently at web site <u>Paypal.com.</u>

3rd Degree Exemplification Planned

At long last, through pandemics and officer rotations, All Saints Council has scheduled the new combined third degree exemplification for Tuesday Evening September 13th at 7:30 PM in McGivney Hall. Previous robes used are eliminated in favor of blue blazers, ties, and yellow sashes (shown) worn by the exemplification team. Now families and the public (including women) are invited to observe. Candidates should wear coat and tie for pictures.

The Order has eliminated the previous 1st and 2nd degree exemplification ceremonies in favor of a combined 1-2-3 degree exemplification ceremony. Any new candidate or 1st or 2nd degree brother attending is automatically a full 3rd degree brother. The only other ceremony is the old fourth degree Sir Knight exemplification which has not changed. So soon there will be only Knight and Sir Knight membership degree ranks.

New candidates pay a small partial year membership fee and badge printing fee to join the Order. As always, there is no charge for the observers who participate in the event and a fellowship with light food and refreshments are planned.

There is one caveat. Any existing 1st or 2nd degree brother wishing to graduate to full 3rd degree membership must be up-to-date with a membership payment. We have brothers on our roll who have not paid yearly dues for one or even multiple years. They must first bring their membership status into compliance by bringing a check for \$40 made out to "KofC 11402" before taking the ceremony. This is only fair to the brothers in membership compliance.

Deceased Brother Chalice Remembrances

With all the disturbing news regarding our deceased brothers in the last few years, we note that our 4th degree Sir Knights have not been forgotten. Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly remembers all deceased Sir Knights on engraved chalices given to new priests. The Assembly has now purchased over two dozen chalice and paten kits over the years and now has a total of 25 of such chalice remembrances ongoing.

Chalices have traditionally been presented to diocesan priests, but most families purchase chalices for their own new priests. The Assembly has moved to awarding new chalices to deserving new priests in foreign lands. Three deceased Sir Knight names grace each chalice, and they are all remembered in each Mass said by the recipient. Chalice # 23 will be presented on Sept. 12th after the All Saints 9 AM Mass. Chalices #24 and #25 are not yet assigned. Another good reason to become a fourth degree Sir Knight.

Monsignor Marren put us in touch with a nurse, Ide Maya of Catholic World Missions, who knew of chalice needs in the Congo. We sent two chalices off to her in that country. Chalices #20 and #21 are now presented. Chalice #22 was presented to Msgr. Simon Assamese for a priest in Ghana, Fr. Prince Oti Ayah, pictures were shown in Minutes.

Decedent names were later rearranged to ensure that Wiley Maloof, son Marion Maloof, and dear friend of theirs, Deacon Ed Krise, were all listed on the same chalice #22 together

Chalice #23 is now assigned to Fr. Selvaraj of India for Little Way Messenger priests to use.

In late 2021, the passing of Harvey Moskowitz, Joseph Kane, and Deacon Ray Egan necessitated the planning for chalice #24. Now Chalice #25 is filled with the passing of Schaaf, Stinson, and Klapka. Both chalice #24 and #25 are not yet assigned.

Four Great Bingos in the Books

The council has since voted to fund the entry fee for our council widows as we do at all our Fish Frys.

We hope that our members and spouses participate in this valuable community fun event on the <u>fourth Thursday of every month</u>, except when Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday periods necessitate a one week earlier rescheduling. 11
