Don't forget Bingo is the 2nd Thursday (the 8th) this month due to Christmas.



# Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to the proper procedure for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail or paying at a council meeting still works perfectly well also. Those liking immediate gratification may use the instructions below for a small processing fee.

Brothers,

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2022 are \$40.

Our council website [www.kc11402.org](http://www.kc11402.org) handles electronic payment of council dues as well.

You go to that web site, choose "Pay Dues", and you are connected to the PayPal system. You must have an active independent PayPal account already set up that is directed either to your check book or a credit card for debit purposes.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.75 (which includes a \$1.75 electronic processing fee) by using your PayPal account to debit either a stated credit card or an amount directly out of your chosen checking account just like a debit card does. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently at web site [Paypal.com](http://Paypal.com).

You may still pay your normal 2022 annual dues directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "**KofC Council 11402**" to:

# Homeless Shelter Staff Planning

**Cooks, Lunch Preparers, Servers, Overnight Stay**

*For I was hungry, and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me,

All Saints has been supporting the Bashor Homeless Men's Shelter at The Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and the adjoining Central Presbyterian Church for over 30 years.

All Saints commitment to the Men's Shelter this year involves ten days (five Saturdays and five Sundays) during November until March where we will be preparing dinners and lunches, serving meals, and spending the night at either facility.

The Men's Shelter will have half the number of guests spend the night as they have had in the past, and the guests will all be required to be vaccinated against COVID-19 and wear masks. The overnight volunteers will spend the night and sleep in shifts in a space separate from the guests. The volunteers do not have to be vaccinated against COVID-19, but will be asked to wear masks.

## Nicholas Le ordained a transitional deacon at St. Peter's Basilica

VATICAN CITY—"When I encounter the Lord in prayer, I become joyful," said Pope Francis on the topic of discernment in his Sept. 28 General Audience. The next day, 23 seminarians received ordination to the transitional diaconate in St. Peter's Basilica. One of those young men in the group was Nicholas "Nick" Le, a seminarian of the Archdiocese of Atlanta, who has been studying in the North American College in Rome.

Nick knows how prayer and relationship with the Lord have

brought him and many friends and family closer to Christ. I am grateful to be one of those friends. I have known Nick for some time and have been greatly blessed by the kindness and love that he has shared with me in addition to his rich prayer life, devotion and discernment of God's call.

In addition to a great cloud of witnesses of the saints—some of whom like St. Peter and St. John Paul the Great are buried or entombed meters away—Nick had a cadre of spiritual companions at his side: an archbishop and an auxiliary bishop, priests, a deacon and his wife, a husband and wife and their four children, another

pair with a toddler back home with family, two newly married couples, a seminarian, an engaged couple, single men and women discerning their vocations and his very happy mother watching it all with the blessed Mother Mary and our church. There may not be a better image for the diverse reality of vocation, a beautiful sight which is much needed in our time.

On Thursday, Sept. 29 at 11 a.m. all attending entered through the side of the great church to sit behind St. Peter's Altar where the pope celebrates liturgy. The sacraments of the Eucharist and holy orders were to be celebrated in front of St. Peter's Chair—a 20-foot Bernini sculpture that symbolizes the unbroken laying on of hands between Jesus himself and all who have said yes to that call.

The huge expansive space still felt intimate as we filled the pews awestruck and knelt in prayer. At the start of Mass, Nick walked in with a serious and sincere

demeanor. Not until the fraternal kiss of peace shared between the priests and deacons did he reveal in his smile the joy he undoubtedly had all along. The choir sang the heavenly Biebl setting of the Angelus, a poignant prayer that "it be done unto me according to thy will." After receiving the efficacious sign from the celebrant Bishop Austin A. Vetter of Montana, the new deacon's face lit up and raised to heaven as he processed out.

That night we gathered at a local restaurant to celebrate as did the Lord at Cana. Archbishop Gregory Hartmayer, OFM Conv., joined the festivities.

"To be at Nicholas' diaconate ordination in Rome," he said, "was a special moment for me. I felt as proud as a parent to be present and look back at the 26 years that I have known him. He has grown up to be a fine young man who has embraced his faith with his family's guidance and the help of many others who have been a part of his life."

One of the four young seminarians our Council supports under Supreme's RSVP Program has been elevated to a Transitional Deacon by Archbishop Hartmayer in Rome. This means he is destined to become a full priest and not remain a Deacon.

We should be quite proud of our seminarian support.

On Friday, Nick celebrated a Mass of Thanksgiving, his first Mass as a deacon, with the archbishop. Nick knelt by his side during the eucharistic prayer.

Archbishop Hartmayer has known Nick since his altar serving days at St. Philip Benizi Church in Jonesboro, where then-Father Hartmayer was pastor, offering him his first reconciliation and holy communion. The archbishop noted the seminarian's consistency, leadership, reverence and readiness to step in when needed.

The new deacon will be ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Atlanta on May 27, 2023.

# Seminarian Josh Harris Biography

Here is the biography of one of our four seminarians that we support, Josh Harris. The progress of now Deacon Nicholas Le is on the preceding page. Josh, like Nick Le, is the quarterly recipient of a check from our council to help them progress through their studies.

Josh Harris is a native Atlantan, raised in a mixed-faith home split between Judaism and Christianity. He fell away from religion as a child.

In his mid-twenties, Jesus stole his heart after attending a local protestant Church and reading his Bible. Nearly four years later, he went to Mass with a mentor and left with a newfound peace that surpassed understanding.

He soon joined a Catholic Bible Study and began praying the Rosary daily. In 2019, Josh was

confirmed in RCIA. Two years later left a career in stand-up comedy to enter the seminary. Now in his second year with honors at St. Vincent De Paul Regional Seminary, he's never felt such joy, peace, and purpose.

He launched a monthly campus pro-life ministry, leading other seminarians in prayer outside a local abortion clinic, and has served multiple times alongside the Missionaries of Charity. He has even performed comedy at seminary events.

Josh is incredibly grateful to The Knights of Columbus, who make pursuing Christ's call possible with their prayers and financial support.

# Deceased Sir Knight Chalice Remembrances

With all the sad news regarding deceased brothers in the last few years, our 4th degree Sir Knights are specially remembered. Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly honors all deceased Sir Knights on engraved chalices given to new priests. The Assembly has now purchased over two dozen chalice and paten kits over the years and now has a total of 27 of such chalice remembrances ongoing.

Chalices have traditionally been presented to diocesan priests, but most families purchase chalices for their own new priests. The Assembly has moved to awarding new chalices to deserving new priests in foreign lands. Three deceased Sir Knight names grace each chalice, so they are remembered in each Mass said by the recipient. Chalice # 24 was presented on Oct. 30th after the All Saints 10:30 AM Mass. Chalices #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. The death of Gregory Kane has necessitated a Chalice #26. Chalices are another good reason to become a Sir Knight.

## Future Chalice Report — (Chalice #24 Presented (Chalices #25, #26 Begun))

Monsignor Marren put us in touch with a nurse, Ide Maya of Catholic World Missions, who knew of chalice needs in the Congo. We sent two chalices off to her in that country. Chalices #20 and #21 are now presented. Chalice #22 was presented to Msgr. Simon Assamoah for a priest in Ghana, Fr. Prince Oti Ayah, pictures were shown in August Minutes.

Chalice #23 is presented to Fr. Selvaraj of India for Little Way Messenger priests to use (Sept.).

Chalice #24 is presented to Archbishop George Antony's diocesan priests in India.

In late 2021, the passing of Harvey Moskowitz, Joseph Kane, and Deacon Ray Egan necessitated the planning for chalice #24. Now Chalice #25 is filled with the passing of Schaaf, Stinson, and Klapka. Both chalice #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Two Sir Knight deaths necessitated #26.

# Pumpkin Sales Were Brisk as Usual

Our 18-wheeler full of pumpkins was unloaded on October 1st and distributed all over the All Saints Campus and sales started on Sunday October 2nd.

Sales were brisk. We prepaid this year for all the gourds, and healthy sales quickly recuperated the net costs of produce and transportation and by mid-month all sales were producing profits for charity.

Our produce featured unusual pumpkins not normally found at other venues. We concentrated on red, green, yellow, white, pimpled, and multi-colored pumpkins beside the normal orange ones. We also offered gourds of small and odd-shaped makeup for decorative purposes not easily found in stores. We even washed and waxed the pumpkins if the customers requested.


