Fish Fry is upon us this month!!! Come to the meeting if you can and hear all the details. Either way, get rested up and ready for a great time in this wonderful community event.


Don't forget that even during fish fry, Bingo will go on.

Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to proper procedures for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail works, Paying \$40 at a council meeting by cash check or square credit card reader works perfectly well also.

Those liking immediate remote gratification may use the instructions below. We no longer use PayPal. Now **Zelle** is the proper app to send \$40 electronically. Our web site can also handle credit cards electronically for \$41.50 (\$1.50 process fee).

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2023 are \$40.

Our council website www.kc11402.org handles electronic payment of council dues as well.

Without the need to login, you go to that web site above, choose "Pay Dues", and then you have the ability to:

Our Council Special Honorees

At our January business meeting, we were thrilled to honor six brothers who had received a special recognition from Supreme because they had been members for over 25 years.

Members who are 70 and have served for 25 years are declared “Honorary Life” Knights and their dues are forever excused and the council no longer pays Supreme a yearly assessment for their membership. They also received a permanent plastic membership card and an Honorary Life lapel pin.

Cooks, Lunch Preparers, Servers, Overnight Stay

*For I was hungry, and you gave me food, I was thirsty, and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me,

All Saints has been supporting the Bashor Homeless Men's Shelter at The Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and the adjoining Central Presbyterian Church for over 30 years.

All Saints commitment to the Men's Shelter this year involves ten days (five Saturdays and five Sundays) during November until March where we will be preparing dinners and lunches, serving meals, and spending the night at either facility.

The Men's Shelter will have half the number of guests spend the night as they have had in the past, and the guests will all be required to be vaccinated against COVID-19 and wear masks. The overnight volunteers will spend the night and sleep in shifts in a space separate from the guests. The volunteers do not have to be vaccinated against COVID-19, but will be asked to wear masks.

Thankfully his bible study brothers let us know about his condition. Paul had been going to these classes before his last hospital incarceration after his falls.

We're not sure how our Seminarian Josh Harris got involved with contacting Paul, but we are grateful. Josh is being sponsored by our council at his seminary.

We continue to ask our brothers to pray for this nice man as he enters a new phase of his life. He is single and could use some human contact. Our brothers David Emery and Michael Tobia and maybe others are contacting Paul.

Once again, our All Saints gym will be the center of the Georgia KofC Free Throw Championship universe.



These state finals are both very well-attended and populated by most major state officers. This puts the spotlight on All Saints.

Needless the say, we will need several council volunteers to aide first in our own Council Free Throw event to be held on Sunday, February 5th from 9 AM to 1 PM in our gym. Volunteers will be used in gym setup, and as registrars, ball retrievers, shot counters, and record-keeping/photography. Bring your 9-15 year olds to participate.

When moving into the District and State events, the young participants always bring their fathers and families to the events and we begin to have volunteers from other councils, although we still run the show. No cost.

Deceased Sir Knight Chalice Remembrances

With all the sad news regarding deceased brothers in the last few years, our 4th degree Sir Knights are specially remembered. Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly honors all deceased Sir Knights on engraved chalices given to new priests. The Assembly has now purchased over two dozen chalice and paten kits over the years and now has a total of 27 of such chalice remembrances ongoing.

Chalices have traditionally been presented to diocesan priests, but most families purchase chalices for their own new priests. The Assembly has moved to awarding new chalices to deserving new priests in foreign lands. Three deceased Sir Knight names grace each chalice, so they are remembered in each Mass said by the recipient. Chalice # 24 was presented on Oct. 30th after the All Saints 10:30 AM Mass. Chalices #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Chalice #26 has sadly now been filled with decedents. Chalices are another good reason to become a Sir Knight.

Future Chalice Report — (Chalice #24 Presented (Chalices #25, #26 Begun))

Monsignor Marren put us in touch with a nurse, Ide Maya of Catholic World Missions, who knew of chalice needs in the Congo. We sent two chalices off to her in that country. Chalices #20 and #21 are now presented. Chalice #22 was presented to Msgr. Simon Assamoah for a priest in Ghana, Fr. Prince Oti Ayah, pictures were shown in August Minutes.

Chalice #23 is presented to Fr. Selvaraj of India for Little Way Messenger priests to use (Sept.).

Chalice #24 is presented to Archbishop George Antonysamy's diocesan priests in India.

In late 2021, the passing of Harvey Moskowitz, Joseph Kane, and Deacon Ray Egan necessitated the planning for chalice #24. Now Chalice #25 is filled with the passing of Schaaf, Stinson, and Klapka. Both chalice #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Two Sir Knight deaths necessitated #26.

Chalices #25 and #26 and #27 have been funded.

The next Bingo is Thursday February 23rd at 7:30 PM.


