McGivney Brother Wins Super Bowl

When placekicker Harrison Butker kicked the winning field goal for the Kansas City Chiefs in the 2023 Super Bowl with 8 seconds left, we All Saints Knights should have been mighty proud. Our exemplification team made Butker a brother knight in 2015. He was a member of the Georgia Tech Council group that came to our hall for exemplification, since they lacked their own team.

Two weeks before this Super Bowl LVII win, Butker also kicked the winning field goal with three seconds left to beat the Cincinnati Bengals in the AFC championship game as well.

He was already a celebrity when he was exemplified in McGivney. He had just recently kicked the 53-yard field goal with three seconds left that tied Georgia in the 2014 Thanksgiving Tech vs. Georgia game that allowed Tech to win in overtime.

This young man with nerves of steel credits the Georgia Tech Catholic Center with its Knight Council and some close teammates for bringing him back to the faith that serves him so well.



The Chiefs Needed Mahomes' Arm — and Butker's Leg

This marks the third time in a row that Butker has been key in a Chiefs AFC Champion-ship game. In 2021, he kicked a field goal that sent the game against the Buffalo Bills into overtime, and the Chiefs ultimately won with a touchdown.

In 2022, in the final seconds of regulation, he did the same thing against the Cincinnati Bengals. But this time, it was Bengals kicker Evan McPherson that made the gamewinning overtime field goal.

But in 2023, that turned around. In Butker's own words:

"The AFC Championship Game was probably the biggest kick of my career – it always happens to be the playoff games where they're game-tying or game-winning kicks," Butker said. "And to be able to make that through was obviously thanks to God for allowing the kick to go through.


"I know it sounds weird, but I always pray for God's will to be done. So whether that's a make or a miss, if I'm doing my absolute best to maximize the talents that He gave me, if it doesn't go in, I'm going to keep the process and keep going as much as I can until I'm not kicking footballs anymore."

KofC Free Throw Tournaments

Once again, our All Saints gym will be the center of the Georgia KofC Free Throw Championship universe.

Previously the state finals have been held in large public arenas like the Omni and then Georgia Tech, but state officials have now decided that All Saints can do it better and certainly at lower cost using our facilities.

Our Community Chairman, Bryan Kler, is the official host of our first local council event, and then he hosts the District and then the all-important and visible State finals. These state finals are both very well attended and populated by most major state officers. This puts the spotlight on All Saints.



Needless the say, we needed several council volunteers to aide first in our own Council Free Throw event that was held on Sunday, February 5th from 9 AM to 1 PM in our gym. Volunteers were used in gym setup, and as registrars, ball retrievers, shot counters, and record-keeping/photography. All 9-15 year olds were eligible to participate.

When moving into the District and State events, the young participants always bring their fathers and families to the events and we begin to have volunteers from other councils, although we still run the show. No cost.

Please volunteer or come to observe these fun events. District Tournament is on Sunday March 5th, while the State Tournament is on Saturday March 25th.

Council Reconfigures Gym Kitchen

Every year the Council assesses the condition of the two gym kitchens to decide if any new equipment or repairs are needed for the eight Lenten Fish Fry events. In past years, the Council has purchased ovens, freezers, refrigerators, electrical lines and breakers, tables, plumbing, and all manner of items for the kitchens. Although most of these things are totally necessary for the Fish Frys, the parish inherits them for use by anyone throughout the year.

This year one of the two \$7500 convection ovens which was decades old finally gave up its ghost and the council sprang for a new one. This was a major installation of a 500 pound unit, and the brothers gathered some muscle to ensure it got done. The movement of large units and associated plumbing and wiring allowed a little housecleaning behind the scenes as well. We doubt if the public can possibly appreciate the scope of our Fish Fry preparations. Special thanks to brothers Woody Jones for ordering and Joe DeVita for installing the unit.


February Fish Fry Summary

The 2023 Lenten Fish Fry season kicked off with three Frys in the month of February. The remaining five Frys will take place in March.

Our practice Fry took place on February 17th and was open to the entire Parish this year as opposed to only Knights and their guests in past years. One huge surprise was the visit of Bill and Debbie Driscoll (now of Buffalo) who unexpectedly drove in from a visit in closer Kentucky. It was sure nice to see them again. Bill remains a member in our Council.

The first three Frys show a steady growth in numbers, but are not equal to post-Covid numbers. We hope to get back into the 1000-plus meal area steadily in March. The first three Frys served 412, 573, and 825 patron meals increasing respectfully. Most councils would kill for those numbers. Nearby Mary Our Queen has instituted a fish fry as well.

We were visited by two members of the press recently who will publicize our events. The kitchens are running very smoothly.

About 400 places plus a takeout area can serve shifts of patrons well past 1000. In fact, our record is 1422 meals served in 3 hours. What restaurant can perform such a feat!

DUNWOODY, Ga. — If you're in the mood for a plate of fried fish so good you'll thank your lucky stars that friers and fish exist, All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody has you covered.

For more than two decades, All Saints Church, its Knights of Columbus chapter and an army of volunteers have supported charity groups throughout the region, funded through proceeds from fried cod, shrimp, salmon and unbeatable clam chowder.

Tom Simon, a Dunwoody resident and event organizer, said the fish fry begins each year on Ash Wednesday and lasts for six Fridays in February and March. But it isn't just All Saints Church patrons who turn out. Each night they feed nearly 1,200 people of all different backgrounds, religions and origins.

That goes through the entire community, not just Dunwoody, but the entire metropolitan area," Simon said. "We've actually had people from Australia, Hawaii, Seattle, New York. You

"It's a social event for Dunwoody," said BJ Van Gundy, another event organizer.

Simon and Van Gundy said the church typically raises roughly \$30,000 in charitable contributions from the fish fry for groups they believe in, like the Special Olympics, the Boy Scouts and ICare, the volunteer ride service for seniors.

We do it because we have a bunch of charities that we provide funds to that they can continue their good works," Simon

said.

But all that food and funding doesn't happen without a lot of help and hard work. Van Gundy said each fish fry takes at least 100 volunteers of all ages, who start preparing food at 9 a.m., serve meals and bus tables and clean the space until about 9 p.m.

With volunteer help, they turn the All Saints Church gym into Dunwoody's largest restaurant for seven nights each year and function as a well-oiled machine capable of turning out a meal every 6 seconds at peak times.

"It's a continual effort by Knights, their spouses, the Boy Scouts, the Girl Scouts,

some of the kids of the of the Knights,' Simon said. "So, it's a community effort."

Deceased Sir Knight Chalice Remembrances

With all the sad news regarding deceased brothers in the last few years, our 4th degree Sir Knights are specially remembered. Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly honors all deceased Sir Knights on engraved chalices given to new priests. The Assembly has now purchased over two dozen chalice and paten kits over the years and now has a total of 27 of such chalice remembrances ongoing.

Chalices have traditionally been presented to diocesan priests, but most families purchase chalices for their own new priests. The Assembly has moved to awarding new chalices to deserving new priests in foreign lands. Three deceased Sir Knight names grace each chalice, so they are remembered in each Mass said by the recipient. Chalice # 24 was presented on Oct. 30th after the All Saints 10:30 AM Mass. Chalices #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Chalice #26 has sadly now been filled with decedents. Chalices are another good reason to become a Sir Knight.

Future Chalice Report — (Chalice #24 Presented (Chalices #25, #26 Begun)) Monsignor Marren put us in touch with a nurse, Ide Maya of Catholic World Missions, who knew of chalice needs in the Congo. We sent two chalices off to her in that country. Chalices #20 and #21 are now presented. Chalice #22 was presented to Msgr. Simon Assamoah for a priest in Ghana, Fr. Prince Oti Avah, pictures were shown in August Minutes. Chalice #23 is presented to Fr. Selvaraj of India for Little Way Messenger priests to use (Sept.). Chalice #24 is presented to Archbishop George Antonysamy's diocesan priests in India. In late 2021, the passing of Harvey Moskowitz, Joseph Kane, and Deacon Ray Egan necessitated the planning for chalice #24. Now Chalice #25 is filled with the passing of Schaaf, Stinson, and Klapka. All Saints has been supporting the Bashor Homeless Men's Shelter at The Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and the adjoining Central Presbyterian Church for over 30 years.

Fish Fry Goes Through March


Ready or not, the annual All Saints Fish Fry is rolling strong again.


