We will be talking to some of you about stepping up into some leadership positions. Remember, it's a team effort. It takes everyone involved to make this council as special as it is.

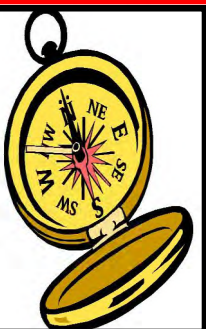
Nominations will be presented at the May meeting with elections following any additional nominations in June.

# Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to proper procedures for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail works, Paying \$40 at a council meeting by cash check or square credit card reader works perfectly well also.

Those liking immediate remote gratification may use the instructions below. We no longer use PayPal. Now **Zelle** is the proper app to send \$40 electronically. Our web site can also handle credit cards electronically for \$41.50 (\$1.50 process fee).

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2023 are \$40.

# 2023 Fish Fry Summary

The 2023 Lenten Fish Fry season started off a little “fishy” in February, but continually picked up steam into March. It was nice seeing people rediscover the fun of a community fest each Friday in Lent. We all got a dispensation from the Archbishop on the Friday of St. Patrick Day, but loads of folks stuck with fish in our gym.

The first four Frys showed a slow steady upward growth in numbers, but were not equal to pre-Covid numbers. By the third fry, we were already flirting with the 1,000 mark (825), and then, it was four-digit territory all the way after that.

Here are the graphs showing the number of meals served every event compared to other years, and a bar graph showing progressive results versus other year fish frys as well. You should be able to see from the final bar chart that our results were quite in line with our previous good years. We are very pleased with the results.

We finished with 7,984 meals served which was 136 more meals than last year. Our all-time high was 8,779 in 2016 (pre-COVID).

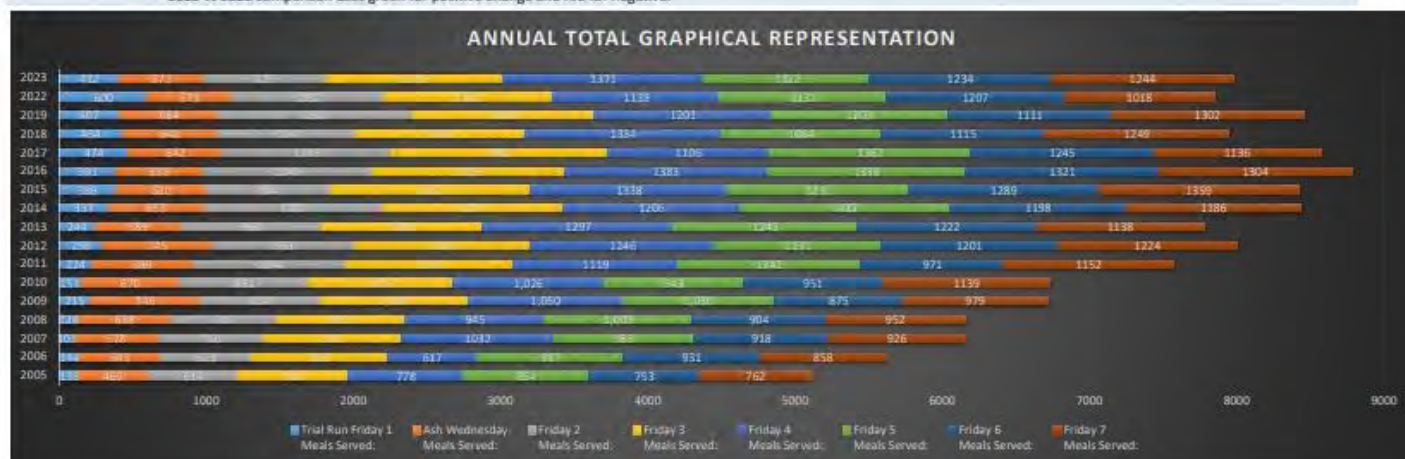
We had a blockbuster night of 1,371 meals, but couldn’t break our record of 1,462 meals.

We had record revenue this year, because we upped the price of two meals \$1. Other councils would kill for our results. Thank you all.

# Vidalia Onions are Back!

On Saturday/Sunday April 29/30, the sale of Vidalia Onions was held at the doors of the church. This year 1,850 bags for all involved parishes were ordered.

Nine parishes were involved in the sale which was managed by All Saints Sir Knights Dean Trantow and Dick Marklein. Sir Knight BJ Van Gundy handled the Signup Genius emails.

Parishes involved this year were St. Brigid (225 bags,) St. Brendan (200), St. Joseph Athens (225), St. Benedict (250), Mary Our Queen (130), Sacred Heart (100), Good Shepherd (140), St. Monica (100), and Holy Spirit (75).

Last year, inflationary food and transportation pressures required an increase of cost for ten-pound bags to \$12.50. Same price this year.

Northside Tool Rental on Mcelroy Rd. in Doraville again donated the heavy equipment needed to unload and move the pallets. Consider them when you need tool rentals.



## Unloading the Onions

Neither steady rain, the heavy traffic on Mt. Vernon Rd., parishioners going to 9 AM Mass, mothers dropping off their pre-school children, or a troublesome fork lift stopped your Knight brothers from unloading 1600-1700 bags of Vidalia onions on March 27th from a 53-foot semi.

Brother Willy Trent professionally operated the fork lift to stack the onions in the parking lot near the bell tower. Then other councils were scheduled to pick up their orders and the bulk was left to us.

# Fr. Kevin Peek—25 Years a Priest

The article reported:

**"Father Kevin Peek, son of Joseph and Mary Peek, was raised in Decatur. He attended seminary at Mount St. Mary's in Emmitsburg, Maryland. He was ordained on June 13, 1998.**

**After ordination, he was assigned as parochial vicar at Holy Trinity Church in Peachtree City. Father Peek was then pastor of Sts. Peter and Paul Church in Decatur for two years. From 2004-2008 he was chaplain at Blessed Trinity High School in Roswell. Father Peek also served the Georgia Tech Catholic Center as chaplain.**

**Currently he coordinates hospital and airport ministries and serves prison ministry and is a member of the Georgia National Guard.**

**His hobbies are soccer, food, spending time with friends and family, and traveling.**

**Father Peek said that "reconciling people to God and to his Church; healing and restoring them to God and to themselves," is most meaningful. "**

**Bingo is open to the community and fun for all ages. Located in the All Saints Social Hall, doors will open at 6:30 PM with Bingo starting at 7:30 PM (limited to the first 175 people). A typical dinner menu includes sausage and pasta, peppers & onions ( a meatless selection will also be available), along with beer, wine, and soft drinks. Admission is \$18 with cash payouts over \$1000 plus 50/50 raffle (split cash drawing) and free gift card raffles.**

**Our Bingo charity profits are already surpassing our Fish Fry yearly efforts.**

**Our events start at 7:30, and we deem it inadvisable to start at 7 PM, because people need to drive home and freshen up before arriving. We need to start promptly to ensure we finish before 10 PM.**

**Our twelfth post-Covid Bingo event on April 27th had 139 players.** It looks as if we are in a healthy groove for monthly participants.

**The council has opted to fund the entry fee for our council widows, as we do at all our Fish Frys and other events. No widows played for free in March.**

**We hope that our members and spouses participate in this valuable community fun event on the fourth Thursday of every month, (except when Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday periods necessitate an earlier scheduling).**

# Homeless Shelter Service Completed

**All Saints Catholic Church Men's Shelter Ministry cooked and served dinner, provided sack lunches, and spent the night with the men at the Bashors' Homeless Men's Overnight Shelter on ten nights between October and March.**

**Knights Dave Emery, John Coffey and Paul Weidle shared the responsibility purchasing lunch items, oversaw the work of the Lunch Crew to prepare lunches, ensured attendance of Servers, and oversaw the overnight crew who spent the night in the shelter with the men. All Saints parishioners Janice Smith, Elaine Dolt, and Nicole Nelson shared the responsibility for the dinner meal preparation.**

**The Shelter started off hosting a total of 50 men split between the two sites – Central Presbyterian Church and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. By November, they shifted all the men to be housed at Central Presbyterian due to difficulty getting enough overnight volunteers to staff both sites. This is probably due to prior volunteers getting out of sync with the shelter since 2019.**

**In 2020 and 2021, the overnight portion of the shelter had closed and our ministry was providing takeaway dinner and lunches to the homeless from the Shrine parking lot. The Shelter was running at ~50% usual occupancy, which meant ~50 men per night served. The Knights of Columbus made a \$1,000 donation to offset the cost of the lunches; we spent \$900 on lunches and donated the other \$100 to the Shelter.**

**We want to make special mention of Don and Barbara Hanson who have helped prepare lunches every week for the past 5 years or more. They have been stalwarts of service and do it each time with grace and humility.**

**There were also dozens of parishioners who came and helped prepare lunches and others who served the meals at the shelter, including students who registered service hours.**

# Deceased Sir Knight Chalice Remembrances

With all the sad news regarding deceased brothers in the last few years, our 4th degree Sir Knights are specially remembered. Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly honors all deceased Sir Knights on engraved chalices given to new priests. The Assembly has now purchased over two dozen chalice and paten kits over the years and now has a total of 27 of such chalice remembrances ongoing.

Chalices have traditionally been presented to diocesan priests, but most families purchase chalices for their own new priests. The Assembly has moved to awarding new chalices to deserving new priests in foreign lands. Three deceased Sir Knight names grace each chalice, so they are remembered in each Mass said by the recipient. Chalice # 24 was presented on Oct. 30th after the All Saints 10:30 AM Mass. Chalices #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Chalice #26 has sadly now been filled with decedents. Chalices are another good reason to become a Sir Knight.

## Future Chalice Report — (Chalices #25, #26 Filled—Chalice #27 Begun))

Monsignor Marren put us in touch with a nurse, Ide Maya of Catholic World Missions, who knew of chalice needs in the Congo. We sent two chalices off to her in that country. Chalices #20 and #21 are now presented. Chalice #22 was presented to Msgr. Simon Assamoah for a priest in Ghana, Fr. Prince Oti Ayah, pictures were shown in August Minutes.

Chalice #23 is presented to Fr. Selvaraj of India for Little Way Messenger priests to use (Sept.).

Chalice #24 is presented to Archbishop George Antonysamy's diocesan priests in India.

In late 2021, the passing of Harvey Moskowitz, Joseph Kane, and Deacon Ray Egan necessitated the planning for chalice #24. Now Chalice #25 is filled with the passing of Schaaf, Stinson, and Klapka. Both chalice #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Three Sir Knight deaths completed #26.

Chalice #27 has been funded and John Trombino is first added.

# Sir Knight John Trombino has Passed

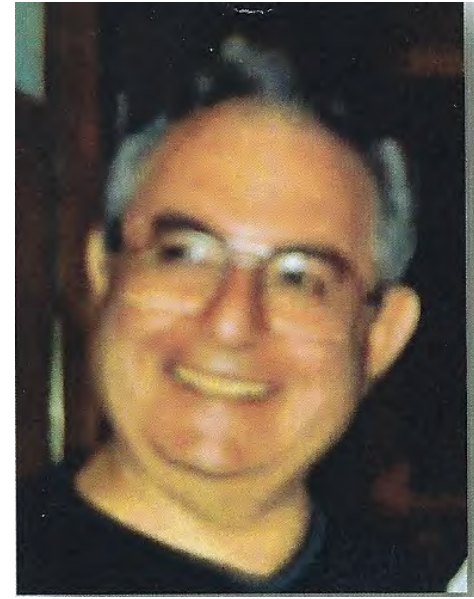
John P. Trombino, 84, was a member of All Saints Council and a Sir Knight in the Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly since 2004.

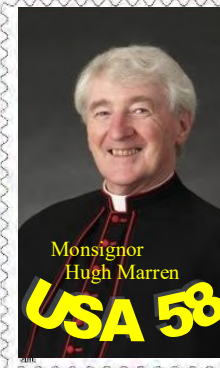
