We all also need to welcome our new Pastor and help him to feel a part of our parish community as well as an important member of our council.


You've all heard me say it before, and I'll say it one last time, I am as your GK but a coordinator. It is all of you that take an active role that are the real force behind all the good we do.

Those liking immediate remote gratification may use the instructions below. We no longer use PayPal. Now **Zelle** is the proper app to send \$40 electronically. Our web site can also handle credit cards electronically for \$41.50 (\$1.50 process fee).

All Saints New Pastor



Msgr. Hugh Marren is resigning as pastor of All Saints Church to serve in other capacities as a senior priest.

With the announcement of the pending retirement of Monsignor Hugh Marren on July 1st, 2023, Archbishop Hartmayer has chosen his replacement at All Saints Church in Dunwoody to be Fr. Michael Silloway.

Father Silloway is currently the pastor of Christ Our King and Savior Church (COKAS.org) in Greensboro, GA. Fr. Mike's impressive resume is shown below. We welcome him to the parish.

He is 40 years of age. He started at the University of Georgia before leaving for the seminary. After years of study in Ohio and Rome, Italy, he became a priest at St. Peter Basilica.

His various Vicar posts have been at St. Theresa in Douglasville, the Cathedral of Christ the King in Atlanta, and St. Pius X in Atlanta. He is basically a Georgia subplant, although born in New Jersey. Here are his words upon coming a pastor in Greensboro.

Friends,

I am Fr. Michael Silloway, blessed to be assigned here at Christ Our King and Savior Catholic Church. I echo our Blessed Mother's song of praise in that "The Lord has done great things for me and holy is His Name" (Luke 1:49).

Born in New Jersey just before Christmas of 1982, my early childhood was in the "frozen tundra" of the north. The Blizzard of '93 that blanketed the entire east coast of the nation is my last memory of living up there as my family moved to Peachtree City, Georgia, looking for better jobs for my parents and quality education for my siblings and me. So now most of my life has been covered in the grace of being an adopted Southerner.

After high school, I was accepted to UGA and went off to study anything that would help me become a pilot. But in my second year as a Bulldog, the Lord began to speak clearly in my heart, calling me to Himself. This caused me to start praying more, and the more I prayed, the more convicted I became that God wanted me to become a priest.

Becoming a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Atlanta in 2003, I was transferred to Franciscan University of Steubenville in Ohio to complete my undergraduate degree in Theology and the necessary requirements for seminary. Three amazing years later, I was sent to Rome, Italy, to the Pontifical North American College to be formed as a priest.

During the five years there, I earned a Sacred Theology Bachelor's degree from the Pontifical Gregorian University and a Sacred Theology Licentiate from the Lateran University's St. John Paul II Pontifical Institute for Studies in Marriage and the Family. I was ordained a deacon in St. Peter's Basilica in 2009 and a priest of Jesus Christ forever at the Cathedral of Christ the King in Atlanta on June 26, 2010.

I served a brief summer as Parochial Vicar at St. Theresa's Catholic Church in Douglasville and almost two years in the same role at the Cathedral of Christ the King in Atlanta. Most recently, I served as Chaplain at St. Pius X Catholic High School in Atlanta for five and a half years. Now, the summer of 2018 has brought me out here to serve as pastor in Greene, Putnam, and Hancock counties at COKAS.

I am grateful especially for our two most recent pastors, Fr. Roberto Herrera and Fr. Philip Ryan, who have led and guided this community of faith over the past 13 years, building on the amazing foundation laid by the intrepid and visionary Catholics of the Lake Oconee region.

I look forward to meeting you and your families and journeying with you as we make our pilgrimage to the Lord. Please pray for me, and know of my daily prayers for you and all the souls in this amazing parish!

2023 Fish Fry Summary

The 2023 Lenten Fish Fry season started off a little “fishy” in February, but continually picked up steam into March. It was nice seeing people rediscover the fun of a community fest each Friday in Lent. We all got a dispensation from the Archbishop on the Friday of St. Patrick Day, but loads of folks stuck with fish in our gym.

The first four Frys showed a slow steady upward growth in numbers, but were not equal to pre-Covid numbers. By the third fry, we were already flirting with the 1,000 mark (825), and then, it was four-digit territory all the way after that.

Here are the graphs showing the number of meals served every event compared to other years, and a bar graph showing progressive results versus other year fish frys as well. You should be able to see from the final bar chart that our results were quite in line with our previous good years. We are very pleased with the results.

We finished with 7,984 meals served which was 136 more meals than last year. Our all-time high was 8,779 in 2016 (pre-COVID).


We had a blockbuster night of 1,371 meals, but couldn’t break our record of 1,462 meals.

We had record revenue this year, because we upped the price of two meals \$1. Other councils would kill for our results. Thank you all.

Vidalia Onions are Back!

On Saturday/Sunday April 29/30, the sale of Vidalia Onions was held at the doors of the church. This year 1,850 bags for all involved parishes were ordered.

Nine parishes were involved in the sale which was managed by All Saints Sir Knights Dean Trantow and Dick Marklein. Sir Knight BJ Van Gundy handled the Signup Genius emails.

Parishes involved this year were St. Brigid (225 bags,) St. Brendan (200), St. Joseph Athens (225), St. Benedict (250), Mary Our Queen (130), Sacred Heart (100), Good Shepherd (140), St. Monica (100), and Holy Spirit (75).

Last year, inflationary food and transportation pressures required an increase of cost for ten-pound bags to \$12.50. Same price this year.

Northside Tool Rental on Mcelroy Rd. in Doraville again donated the heavy equipment needed to unload and move the pallets. Consider them when you need tool rentals.

Brother Willy Trent professionally operated the fork lift to stack the onions in the parking lot near the bell tower. Then other councils were scheduled to pick up their orders and the bulk was left to us.

Deceased Sir Knight Chalice Remembrances

With all the sad news regarding deceased brothers in the last few years, our 4th degree Sir Knights are specially remembered. Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly honors all deceased Sir Knights on engraved chalices given to new priests. The Assembly has now purchased over two dozen chalice and paten kits over the years and now has a total of 27 of such chalice remembrances ongoing.

Chalices have traditionally been presented to diocesan priests, but most families purchase chalices for their own new priests. The Assembly has moved to awarding new chalices to deserving new priests in foreign lands. Three deceased Sir Knight names grace each chalice, so they are remembered in each Mass said by the recipient. Chalice # 24 was presented on Oct. 30th after the All Saints 10:30 AM Mass. Chalices #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Chalice #26 has sadly now been filled with decedents. Chalices are another good reason to become a Sir Knight.

Future Chalice Report — (Chalices #25, #26, #27 Filled-Awaiting Recipients)

Monsignor Marren put us in touch with a nurse, Ide Maya of Catholic World Missions, who knew of chalice needs in the Congo. We sent two chalices off to her in that country. Chalices #20 and #21 are now presented. Chalice #22 was presented to Msgr. Simon Assamoah for a priest in Ghana, Fr. Prince Oti Ayah, pictures were shown in August Minutes.









Chalice #23 is presented to Fr. Selvaraj of India for Little Way Messenger priests to use (Sept.).

Chalice #24 is presented to Archbishop George Antonysamy's diocesan priests in India.

In late 2021, the passing of Harvey Moskowitz, Joseph Kane, and Deacon Ray Egan necessitated the planning for chalice #24. Now Chalice #25 is filled with the passing of Schaaf, Stinson, and Klapka. Both chalice #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Three Sir Knight deaths completed #26.

Chalice #27 has been funded. John Trombino, William Luckert, Alfred Garofalo filled it.



Sir Knight John Trombino has Passed


John P. Trombino, 84, was a member of All Saints Council and a Sir Knight in the Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly since 2004.

Honorable Richard P. McCully *Has Passed*

AUGUST 4, 1942 – MAY 21, 2023



Judge Richard P. McCully passed peacefully at home in Dunwoody, Georgia, on May 21, 2023, after a well-fought battle with cancer. He was 80. Born Aug. 4, 1942, in Highland Park, Michigan, Judge McCully served in the Navy from 1960-62 stationed in Memphis, Tennessee. He graduated from the University of Memphis with a BS in 1965 and a JD in 1968. He also received an MPA from the University of Tennessee in 1975 and attended the FBI National Law Institute in 1986. He was admitted to the State Bars of Tennessee and Florida and the U.S. Supreme Court.

He was also a Distinguished Service Award Recipient for his work with the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity and an Honorary Lifetime Member of the Touchdown Club of Atlanta. Further, Judge McCully served on the Board of the St. Thomas More Society of Atlanta, a non-profit group of Catholic lawyers. Following his retirement, he was actively involved in the Citizen on Patrol program for the Dunwoody Police Department.

Judge McCully's lifelong love of being on the water led him to spend much of his free time over 50 years serving with the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary from 1972 to 2022. His other passion was the Miami Hurricanes. He seldom missed a game and served as President of the University of Miami Hurricane Club. He was seldom seen without his Hurricane jacket or cap wherever he traveled.

Raised in Jackson, Michigan, and an alumni of Howe Military Academy, Judge McCully was predeceased by his grandmother Gertrude "Mimi" McCully, Register of Deeds for Jackson County and longtime head of the Jackson County GOP, his father, John M. McCully, owner of Miller's Clothing in Jackson, his mother Evelyn McCully (nee Richards) and his younger brother, Michael E. McCully.

Judge McCully is survived by his wife Janet, his daughter Colleen Stephens (Christopher) and two grandsons Jacob and Luke Stephens of Ft. Payne, Alabama, three step-children Christopher Carr of Dunwoody, Dr. Sarah Carr Evans of Sandy Springs, Georgia, Toby Carr of Watkinsville, Georgia, their spouses, and seven step-grandchildren. He is also survived by his sister Maureen McCully Winograd of New York City and Estero, Florida.


