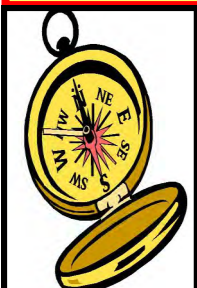

Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to proper procedures for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail works, Paying \$40 at a council meeting by cash check or square credit card reader works perfectly well also.

Those liking immediate remote gratification may use the instructions below. We no longer use PayPal. Now **Zelle** is the proper app to send \$40 electronically. Our web site can also handle credit cards electronically for \$41.50 (\$1.50 process fee).

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2023 are \$40.

Our council website www.kc11402.org handles electronic payment of council dues as well.

Without the need to login, you go to that web site above, choose "Pay Dues", and then you have the ability to:

New All Saints Seminarian

All Saints has been assigned a seminarian for the next year who will reside with us and participate in our services. Mr. Sean Lee is a fourth degree knight who will grace us with his presence for a year.

Below is Fr. Michael's welcoming article that appeared in our parish bulletin.

Did you know priests come from seeds?

The portion of his life that a priest spends in serious discernment and preparation for Holy Orders takes place at a school called a seminary, which gets its name from the Latin *seminarium*, which means "seed bed". The man planted in the seed bed for that time of formation is called a "seminarian" until ordination, which is the moment his vocation starts to bear the fruit of ministerial graces.

The seminary experience is usually three or four years of philosophy studies followed by four years of theology, with conferences, spiritual direction, retreats, apostolic and pastoral ministry training and experience, all with a fishbowl-like constant evaluation. They certainly prepare you to die to self and live for Christ, which resonates well with Our Lord's image of seeds needing to die in order to bear fruit.

We have been blessed with a unique opportunity this year to host one of these priest-seeds at All Saints, Mr. Sean Lee.

Part of the formation program is a year in a parish, experiencing the full breadth of priestly parish life. I know we've hosted guys for various summer assignments, but the "pastoral year" is a critically important step, where a man dives in, plugs in, invests his heart and energy in the Lord's Beautiful Bride, the Church.

Sean will be everywhere, expected to take part in everything we priests do (except hear confessions!) and I, for one, am very excited for him. It's a great honor for a parish to be trusted with hosting a pastoral year seminarian, as we will have a unique role in forming his priestly heart! God-willing, Sean will be ordained a transitional deacon in two years, and then a priest the summer after that.

So please welcome him as you so graciously welcomed me. And pray for this priest-seed with whom we've been entrusted. May he bear much fruit, fruit that lasts to eternity!

Particular pumpkin pickers can soon rejoice, because All Saints Catholic Church will be opening its famous **Pumpkin Patch** on **October 1st, 2023** for all to enjoy.

This is the 18th year that All Saints has hosted the Pumpkin Patch event. The driving force behind the Pumpkin Patch is **Knights of Columbus Council #11402**, a Catholic men's charitable group at All Saints that uses the funds it raises to support local community groups such as **Habitat for Humanity**, **Pregnancy Aid Clinic**, and **COATS for KIDS**.

According to Dave Richardson, a.k.a. the **Big Pumpkin**, a member of the Knights, "We bring in specially selected pumpkins each year by express truck, directly from an out of state grower. Many of the types of quality pumpkins we sell, you probably won't find anywhere else. Parents and their children love our pumpkins, from the huge pumpkins in unique colors, to the small swan gourds that can grace all of your holiday table decorations."

People drive into All Saints from the entire metro area not knowing what to expect, but drive out loaded down with colorful pumpkins and smiles on their faces. Last year, the All Saints Pumpkin Patch sold over 20,000 pounds of pumpkins, that allowed the Knights of Columbus Council #11402 to return thousands of dollars to charitable organizations assisting those in need.

According to Richardson, "The Pumpkin Patch is a win-win for Dunwoody and the surrounding area. We supply the unique pumpkins that everyone wants, and people walk away with a happy heart, knowing their purchases also helped local community projects.

Sir Knight Fr. Dan is Reassigned

To the Parishioners of All Saints,

The Archbishop has informed me that I have a new assignment. After 11 years, I will be leaving All Saints and moving to Holy Trinity parish in Peachtree City. My last weekend in the parish will be September 30 – October 1.

I am extremely grateful for my time here. I wanted to thank you for your support, especially as we found our way through the COVID pandemic together. Celebrating the Easter Vigil in an empty church is something I never thought I would ever do in my priestly ministry and hope to never do again, but it is a reminder that the priest's most fundamental job is to bring Christ to people and be the means by which the people of God encounter Christ.



It has been my privilege to do that here, however imperfectly, for 11 years. To spend that amount of time in one assignment is a great gift. I have several of my former students who now have children of their own who are attending here. It was scary enough when I knew that they had obtained a driver's license, and now they have been given a baby to look after.

Truly the Lord's ways are mysterious, but to journey with people from one stage of life to the next is the heart of the priest's vocation and mission. We are to make Christ present all along the journey of life and to present the departed to him at the end. I will continue to do that in my new assignment as I have tried to do in this one.

I often tell seminarians "Be thankful for the daily mass crowd. It is their prayers that brought you to the altar and their prayers, if you let them, that will keep you at the altar." I thank you for the prayers you have offered with and for me. I know they have sustained me and carried me through difficult parts of my ministry.

Lastly, I cannot take my leave without acknowledging the incredible support of the staff here at All Saints. Space does not allow me to give to each of them the recognition they deserve, but it is an exceptional group who work extremely hard in ways that are often unseen and too little appreciated.

I especially want to thank Bernie and Audene Sotola for their work with the music ministry and the choir and Scott Early for his work with the Life Teen band. They do so much to add dignity, depth, and richness to our liturgies and their good work simply adds to the good work of so many from the staff and parish organizations that contribute so mightily to the life of the parish.

As I bring my time here to a conclusion, let me once again express my gratitude for my time here and express my hope that the Lord who has begun the good work in you, may bring it to completion.

Men's Homeless Shelter Staffing

All Saints Catholic Church Men's Shelter Ministry has committed to serving ten nights at the Bashors' Homeless Men's Overnight Shelter between October and March.

Knights Dave Emery, John Coffey and Paul Weidle will again share responsibility as Captains for purchasing lunch items, oversee the work of the Lunch Crew to prepare lunches, and make assignments for the overnight crew who will spend the night in the shelter with the men. All Saints parishioners Janice Smith, Elaine Dolt, and Nicole Nelson will share the responsibility for the dinner meal preparation and servers at the Shelter.

The Shelter plans to provide service to 100 men per night at the two sites in downtown Atlanta—Central Presbyterian Church and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. We will need to have six people signed up for each night (teens at least 16 years old can serve overnight with permission of their parent). We have five Saturday nights and five Sunday nights this year. If you wonder why we do not get all Saturday nights – it is because the Shelter will only give us half of the nights as Saturday (other groups like Saturdays too).

SK Ronald Collins, 90, Has Passed

Nov. 3, 1932— Sept. 9, 2023

Ronald Daniel Collins was one of the most giving people you would ever meet – he was always happy to help others out any way he could. He was born on the 3rd of November, 1932 in Pukwana, South Dakota, to Rose Collins (nee Reinhart) and Daniel William Collins, then raised in Chicago with his younger brothers Thomas Joseph Collins and Daniel James Collins.

Ron had an early love of working with cars, which later led to his pursuit of a Civil Engineering degree from University of Illinois (Urbana-Champaign). Following graduation in 1955, he would join the Army later that year, then begin a 46-year career as an Army civilian starting on a Mississippi river barge with the Corps of Engineers, culminating in serving as one of the lead engineers responsible for the Army's roads and grounds throughout the US. During his career, he earned two more degrees, a bachelor's degree in business administration, and an MBA. He retired from the Headquarters, US Army Forces Command at Ft. McPherson in 2001.

In April 26, 1958, he married his wife of over 65 years, Jacqueline Gail Collins (nee Lang). The young couple moved from Chicago to Arlington Heights, IL, then San Antonio, TX, then off to Atlanta, where he lived in the same house for 50 years. He insisted that he would live in his Atlanta home for the rest of his life and determined to the end, he did see this through. Following his retirement, Ron became actively involved in the Knights of Columbus, Habitat for Humanity and the Lenten fish fry fundraising dinners at his church at All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody, making many dear friends along the way.

Ron never forgot his farming roots, working a 'small' plot of land each year and raising far more vegetables than the neighborhood could absorb. Through most of his retirement, Ron and Jackie enjoyed a charmed life of international travel, visiting sites all over western and eastern Europe.

Ron is survived by his wife Jackie; his son Kenneth and his wife Marianna; grandson Matthew. His other son David predeceased him, but David is also survived by his wife Ann and grandson Michael.
