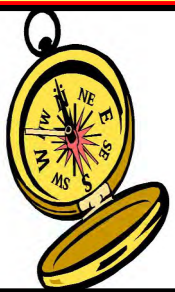

Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to proper procedures for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail works, Paying \$40 at a council meeting by cash, check, or by our “Square” credit card reader device works perfectly well also.

Those liking immediate remote gratification may use the instructions below. We no longer use PayPal. Now **Zelle** is the proper app to send \$40 electronically without fee. Our website can also handle credit cards electronically for \$41.50 (\$1.50 process fee).

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2023 are \$40.

Our council website www.kc11402.org handles electronic payment of council dues by credit card as well.

Without the need to login, you go to that website above, choose "Pay Dues", and then you have the ability to:

Deceased Sir Knight Chalice Remembrances

With all the sad news regarding deceased brothers in the last few years, our 4th degree Sir Knights are specially remembered. Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly honors all deceased Sir Knights on engraved chalices given to new priests. The Assembly has now purchased over two dozen chalice and paten kits over the years and now has a total of 27 of such chalice remembrances ongoing.

Chalices have traditionally been presented to diocesan priests, but most families purchase chalices for their own new priests. The Assembly has moved to awarding new chalices to deserving new priests in foreign lands. Three deceased Sir Knight names grace each chalice, so they are remembered in each Mass said by the recipient. Chalice # 24 was presented on Oct. 30th after the All Saints 10:30 AM Mass. Chalices #25 and #26 are not yet assigned. Chalice #27 has sadly now been filled with decedents. Chalices are another good reason to become a Sir Knight.

Council “Coats for Kids” Program

The Knights of Columbus Order gives away tens of thousands of free new coats every year through Supreme’s “Coats for Kids” Program. The individual councils purchase coats of various kid sizes at KofC group rates to distribute in areas where there is definite need.

Our Council purchased 48 coats in boys and girls sizes and teamed with the Assistance League of Atlanta (ALA) Charity in Chamblee which has a similar huge program called “Operation School Bell” that distributes new coats and school uniforms to local schools each year.

The ALA will merge our coats into their distribution channels to combine our charitable endeavors. Knowing how and where to distribute the coats is always the most challenging part of the project. ALA already has existing programs with local school districts.

Our Sir Knight, John Knight, had four cartons of coats in his living room looking for a permanent home. He contacted Elaine McClean of ALA to facilitate the giveaway. Many of our wives and widows are already members of this non-denominational national charity. In fact, we participate in their golf tournament every year. The two groups are beginning to work together very well.

Their home base in the Atlanta area is the “Attic Treasures” store in Chamblee which is the source of \$800,000 in charitable gifts every year. This group consists of about 250 volunteer women.

At our November council meeting, their Elaine McClean was presented with our coats for distribution. On hand were our wives Shirley Dyer and Marty Hlad who volunteer for ALA also. Many Assistance League ladies are always conspicuous dining at our Fish Frys every year as well.

It’s a beautiful thing when two large charitable organizations work together for common purpose.

Council Eyewear Recycling



Our brother Paul McNulty volunteers for the GA Lighthouse Association to recycle used eyewear of all types to that organization.

He will position a donation box in the knights hall to collect these items rather than throwing them away.

His message is below. Please bring old used eyewear and deposit it for recycling when you come to council meetings.



All eyewear goes through a three-step QA process and those that can be re-used (approx. 70%) are donated to mission groups that travel throughout the world providing glasses to the needy.

The glasses and pieces of eyewear that come in damaged, are then sent to a recycler for which GA Lighthouse receives monies to help operate their free eye testing clinic, which is staffed with a licensed volunteer Optometrist at the Chamblee clinic. As a part of this, clients can receive not only free testing but very low price or free glasses. if they qualify based on income.

They collect **Sun, Prescription, and Reading glasses and know that many of us have multiple pairs of glasses that we no longer need. We either throw them away or keep them in a drawer.**

We would like to ask, that the Brothers bring any unneeded eyewear to the December 5th council meeting, and we will provide a donation box and bring them to GA Lighthouse to help others in need of glasses.

Men's Homeless Shelter Staffing

All Saints Catholic Church Men's Shelter Ministry has committed to serving ten nights at the Bashors' Homeless Men's Overnight Shelter between October and March.

Knights Dave Emery, John Coffey and Paul Weidle will again share responsibility as Captains for purchasing lunch items, oversee the work of the Lunch Crew to prepare lunches, and make assignments for the overnight crew who will spend the night in the shelter with the men. All Saints parishioners Janice Smith, Elaine Dolt, and Nicole Nelson will share the responsibility for the dinner meal preparation and servers at the Shelter.

The Shelter plans to provide service to 100 men per night at the two sites in downtown Atlanta—Central Presbyterian Church and the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. We will need to have six people signed up for each night (teens at least 16 years old can serve overnight with permission of their parent). We have five Saturday nights and five Sunday nights this year. If you wonder why we do not get all Saturday nights – it is because the Shelter will only give us half of the nights as Saturday (other groups like Saturdays too).

History of KofC and Yankee Stadium

The Largest Check K of C Signed

By December 1953, Yankee Stadium was a shrine to baseball with legendary heroes gracing the diamond. However, team owners Dan Topping and Del Webb were looking to sell the stadium and it was around this time that the Knights of Columbus — under the leadership of Supreme Knight Luke Hart — was searching for new investment opportunities, particularly in real estate.



As Supreme Knight Hart describes in the October 1954 issue of *Columbia*, "Then the opportunity to buy the Yankee Stadium ground was brought to our attention by Supreme Treasurer Heazel, who was a friend of some of

In a stunning move, the stadium and property were purchased from financier Arnold Johnson as part of a leaseback investment — the Order bought the real estate (i.e. the land on which Yankee Stadium stood) then leased it back to Johnson, who then, in turn, leased the stadium to the Yankees. Supreme Knight Hart wrote in his diary about the purchase:

"We all met in the Board Room at the Banker's Trust Company in Rockefeller Center. ...The various documents incident to the Yankee deal were executed and I delivered a check for \$2,500,000. ...It was of course, the largest check I ever signed."

From 1954 to 1971, the Order owned the land on which the House of Ruth stood. During that time, the Yankees were a perennial powerhouse behind the bats of Mickey Mantle and Roger Maris, the glove of Yogi Berra and the pitching of Whitey Ford, appearing in the World Series nine times and winning four. One of the most significant years came in 1961 when Mantle and Maris pursued Ruth's single-season home run record of 60 — which Maris broke, notching 61. (Knights of Columbus Multimedia Archives)

Supreme Knight Hart explained the rationale behind the purchase of the land at Yankee Stadium as not only an investment opportunity, but as a way of furthering the mission Father McGivney set out for the Order. As he wrote in a letter to Knights in the January 1954 *Columbia*:

The Knights of Columbus eventually relinquished the rights to field at Yankee Stadium when the city of New York, under Mayor John Lindsay, purchased it in 1971. Of the eighteen real estate investments made during Supreme Knight Luke Hart's term, the Yankee Stadium deal was the most significant.

Hallowed Grounds

On Oct. 4, 1965, the hallowed grounds of baseball's greatest stadium transformed into the hallowed grounds for one of the most significant Masses in the 20th century — and the first Mass on American soil celebrated by a pontiff.
