

## Meaning of the Vatican Flag

Just like other national flags, the design of the Vatican flag has rich meaning.

As the national flag for Vatican City, this flag is displayed not only in this part of Italy, but also in many Catholic churches, universities, and other Catholic institutions.

The flag is modeled after the flag of the Papal States from the early nineteenth century, and is also referred to as the flag of the Holy See. Many earlier papal flags were red and gold.



The left side of the flag is a rich yellow. The right side is white and features the coat of arms of Vatican City. At the top of the coat of arms is the papal tiara, which was worn by popes from the eighth century to the mid-twentieth century.

Beneath the papal tiara are two keys, referring to Matthew 16:19, when Jesus says to St. Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven." The gold key represents spiritual power and the silver key stands for worldly power. The keys are connected with a red cord, which symbolizes how the two powers are bound together.

Regarding the choice of yellow and white for the flag, there are various historical and symbolic explanations for these colors. One possible connection is to the keys themselves: the yellow field corresponding to the gold key, the white to the silver key. In heraldry, yellow is equivalent to gold (the heraldic color *or*) and white to silver (*argent*). The colors certainly offer a striking visual echo of the keys of Peter.

On Saturday July 13th, the international Silver Rose KofC pilgrimage arrived at Council 11402 on its way through the United States, Canada, and Mexico., passing from council to council.

her Mexican appearance.

The Silver Rose program demonstrates the unity between Knights of Columbus in Canada, the United States and Mexico, through a series of prayer services promoting the dignity of all human life and honoring Our Lady.

As usual every year, the Dunwoody Independence Day Parade started from the All Saints parish parking lot. This year's parade was larger than ever and the weather was perfect.




Past Grand Knight Woody Jones drives his Mercedes in the parade with present Grand Knight E.J. Couvillion along for the ride.




### **Council Clergy Reassignments**

The May 30th issue of the <u>Georgia Bulletin</u> has featured an article showing all the priest movements across the diocese of Atlanta. These priests were members or still are members of our council.

- Fr. Kevin Peek is appointed pastor of Saints Peter and Paul Church in Decatur. He is still a council member.
- Father Paul Nacey is appointed parochial vicar of St. Joseph Church in Marietta. He was a seminarian that we supported via our RSVP Program for some years.
- Father Daniel Rogaczewski is appointed parochial vicar of St. Luke Church, and Christ the Redeemer Church in Dawsonville, with residence at St. Luke Church in Dahlonega. He is still a council member.
- Father Daniel Ketter, judicial vicar of the Metropolitan Tribunal, will reside at Holy Spirit Church in Atlanta. He is the son of John Ketter, our council brother, and Father Dan was previously a member of our council before transferring.
- Father Bryan Small is granted a sabbatical with residence at the Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Atlanta. He is still a council member.











#### McGivney Knight National Controversy

Harrison Butker became a member of the Knights of Columbus in our Fr. McGivney Hall in 2015. He was a member of the Georgia Tech Council we helped exemplify here. He went on to be drafted by the Kansas City Chiefs and became a Super Bowl hero.

His remarks at a college graduation commencement speech in Kansas ignited a fury across the nation.

### Butker Defends Stance After Speech Controversy

Kansas City Chiefs kicker stands by traditional values he promoted at commencement speech, saying 'Never be afraid to speak out for truth'

Kansas City Chiefs kicker Harrison Butker has broken his silence on the backlash from his recent speech at a Catholic college in Kansas that encouraged women to become mothers and homemakers, telling an audience on May 24 at an event in Tennessee that despite facing a "shocking level of hate" for his remarks, he remains unapologetic in defense of traditional values.

Mr. Butker said during a gala in Nashville that he stands by his conservative convictions and has no regrets about his commencement speech on May 11 at Benedictine College in Atchison, Kansas. In the speech, he criticized transgenderism and warned women against falling for "diabolical lies" that the only path to a fulfilling life is the pursuit of a career rather than becoming mothers and raising children.

Mr. Butker said the fallout from his speech proves that traditional values are under assault in modern-day America.

"If it wasn't clear that the timeless

Catholic values are hated by many, it is now," he said at the gala.

Mr. Butker said he's aware of having become a "more polarizing" figure the more that he has spoken out in defense of traditional values and that he looks to his Christian faith to give him the courage to face whatever comes his way.

"If I constantly remind myself of the hardships the saints went through, especially the martyrs in their persecution, it makes it all seem not so bad," he said.

"Never be afraid to speak out for truth, even when it goes against the loudest voices.

"In the end, being courageous starts with the small things."

The Speech

The 20-minute commencement speech sparked sharp criticism in some circles, including accusations of homophobia, transphobia, and misogyny.

In the speech, Mr. Butker criticized "dangerous gender ideologies" and referenced a "deadly sins sort of pride that has a month dedicated to it," referring to June being celebrated as "Pride Month" by the LGBT community.

Mr. Butker also encouraged the men in the audience to be "unapologetic" in their masculinity and fight against the "cultural emasculation of men."

He made a case for the traditional female role of child-rearing homemaker, saying women have been lied to about pursuing high-powered careers. He praised his own wife, Isabelle, for choosing her vocation as a homemaker over a career.

The Kansas City Chiefs organization has declined to comment on Mr. Butker's speech, and the National Football League (NFL) distanced itself from his remarks.

"Harrison Butker gave a speech in his

personal capacity," Jonathan Beane, NFL senior vice president and chief diversity and inclusion officer, said in a statement released on May 16.

"His views are not those of the NFL as an organization. The NFL is steadfast in our commitment to inclusion, which only makes our league stronger."

During his speech, Mr. Butker criticized President Joe Biden's stance on abortion.

"He has been so vocal in his support for the murder of innocent babies that I'm sure to many people it appears that you can be both Catholic and pro-choice," he said.

White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre was asked on May 16 to comment on Mr. Butker's criticism.

"The president is not going to back away from supporting women and reproductive rights, reproductive health care," she said.

"I can't speak to those direct comments, but what I can speak to is what the president has committed to."

Kansas City Chiefs tight end Travis Kelce on May 24 said that he "cherishes" Mr. Butker, his teammate. He didn't comment on his views, but said he has only seen Mr. Butker treat people with "nothing but respect and kindness."

Kansas City Chiefs quarterback Patrick Mahomes also defended Mr. Butker, saying he doesn't "necessarily agree with" some of his remarks but that Mr. Butker is someone who cares about the people around him and who "wants to make a good impact in society."

The Chiefs have won the Super Bowl twice with Mr. Butker, who made 94.3 percent of his field goals last season. He has made 89.1 percent of his field goals in his seven-year NFL career.




Harrison Butker of the Kansas City Chiefs speaks to the media at Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas on Feb. 5, 2024.




Since the time the council began, there have been a group of brothers who have met in McGivney Hall on Wednesday evenings to play a friendly game of poker.




