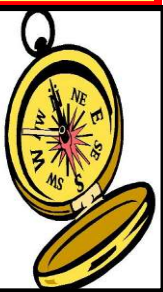

# Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to proper procedures for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail works, Paying \$40 at a council meeting by cash, check, or by our “Square” credit card reader device works perfectly well also.

Those liking immediate remote gratification may use the instructions below. We no longer use PayPal. Now **Zelle** is the proper app to send \$40 electronically without fee. Our website can also handle credit cards electronically for \$41.50 (\$1.50 process fee).

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2023 are \$40.

Our council website [www.kc11402.org](http://www.kc11402.org) handles electronic payment of council dues by credit card as well.

Without the need to login, you go to that website above, choose "Pay Dues", and then you have the ability to:

# Council Brothers Golfing 10-7

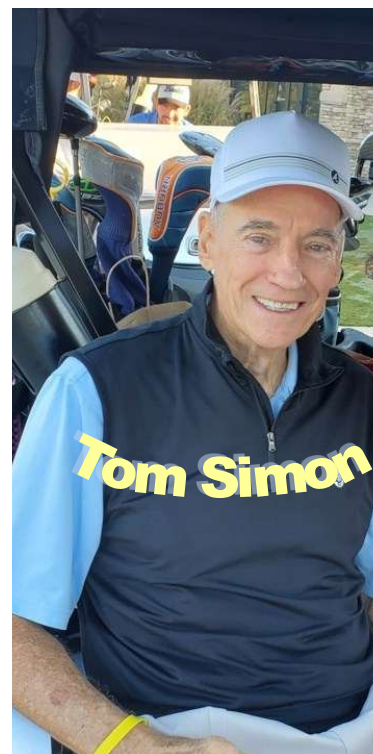

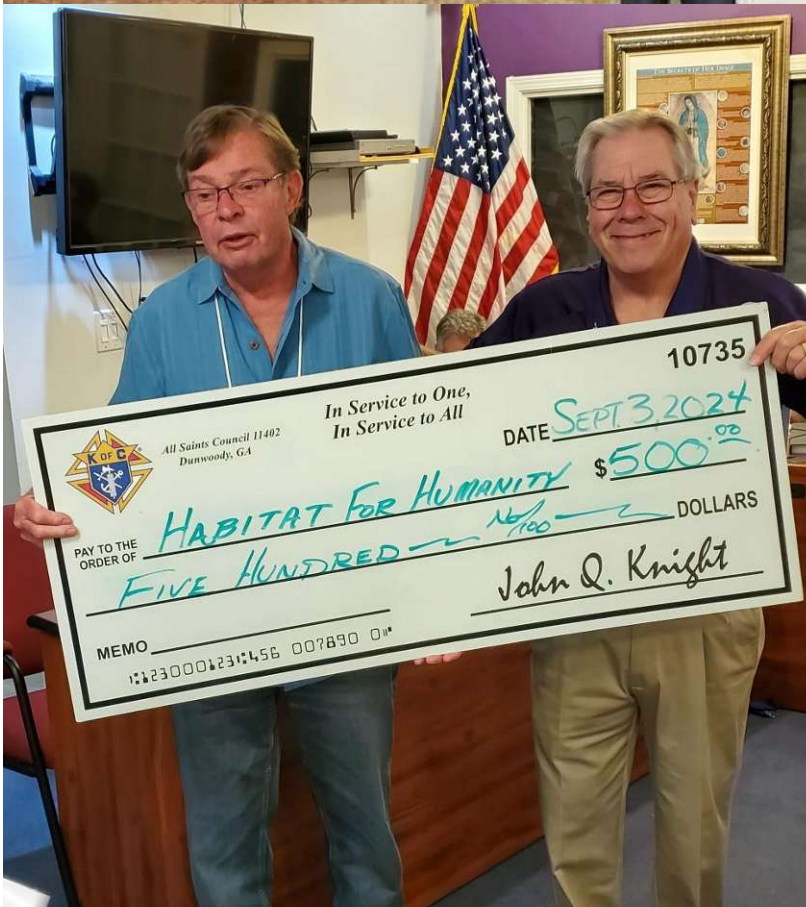

It was a great day for our Council on October 7th, when we visited the joyful Sisters of Visitation at their Monastery in Snellville to celebrate their 50th Jubilee.

Former All Saint's pastor, Monsignor Hugh Marren, celebrated the Mass along with three other Diocesan priests. After Mass and reception, we trekked out to a beautiful field for an unveiling of a new statue of Jesus. At the foot of the statue (which was dedicated to Msgr. and Council 11402), EJ spoke to the crowd about our commitment to supporting them.

This past year Council 11402 donated \$3,500 and a group of knights matched that amount for another \$11,000 on top. In the past three years we've raised over \$40,000 for the sister's operating funds.

Mother Superior Teresa Maria spoke about their love of the Council's generosity and attentiveness to them. The Sisters of Visitation are a contemplative Order that devote most of their day to prayer. Mother told us that all the Special Intentions we sent were placed in a special container inside the base of the sculpture of Jesus. She also said that the Knights are remembered in celebration of Mass at least once per month.



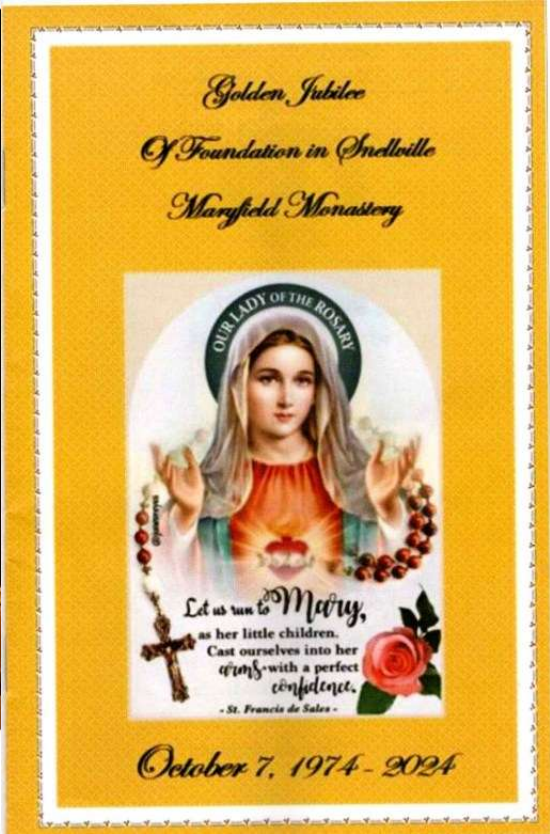

# Council Star Award Presentation

On behalf of the All Saints Knights of Columbus Council #11402, GA State Deputy T.J. McCaustland presented Grand Knight E. J. Couvillion the **STAR Council Award** at the 10:30 mass on Sunday October 20<sup>th</sup>. The plaque represents an achievement of 133% of the recruitment goal, since 20 new knights joined the council in the past Fraternal year. It is the highest award that can be presented by the US Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus. In addition to the **STAR** Award, the plaque contained medallions representing three awards that are major accomplishments by the All Saints Council.

These were the **Fr. McGivney Award** for exceeding new Brother enrollment, **Founders Award** for enrollment in Fraternal Benefits Programs, and the **Columbian Award** for planning and executing **16** events in the Knights Key Program categories of **Faith, Family, Life and Community**.

In remarks to the parishioners, Grand Knight Couvillion informed the Mass attendees that the brothers of Council #11402 have contributed over **40,000** manhours of service, and more than \$44,000 of charitable donations from proceeds from their Lenten **Fish Fry** events, **Pumpkin Patch** and **Vidalia Onion** sales.

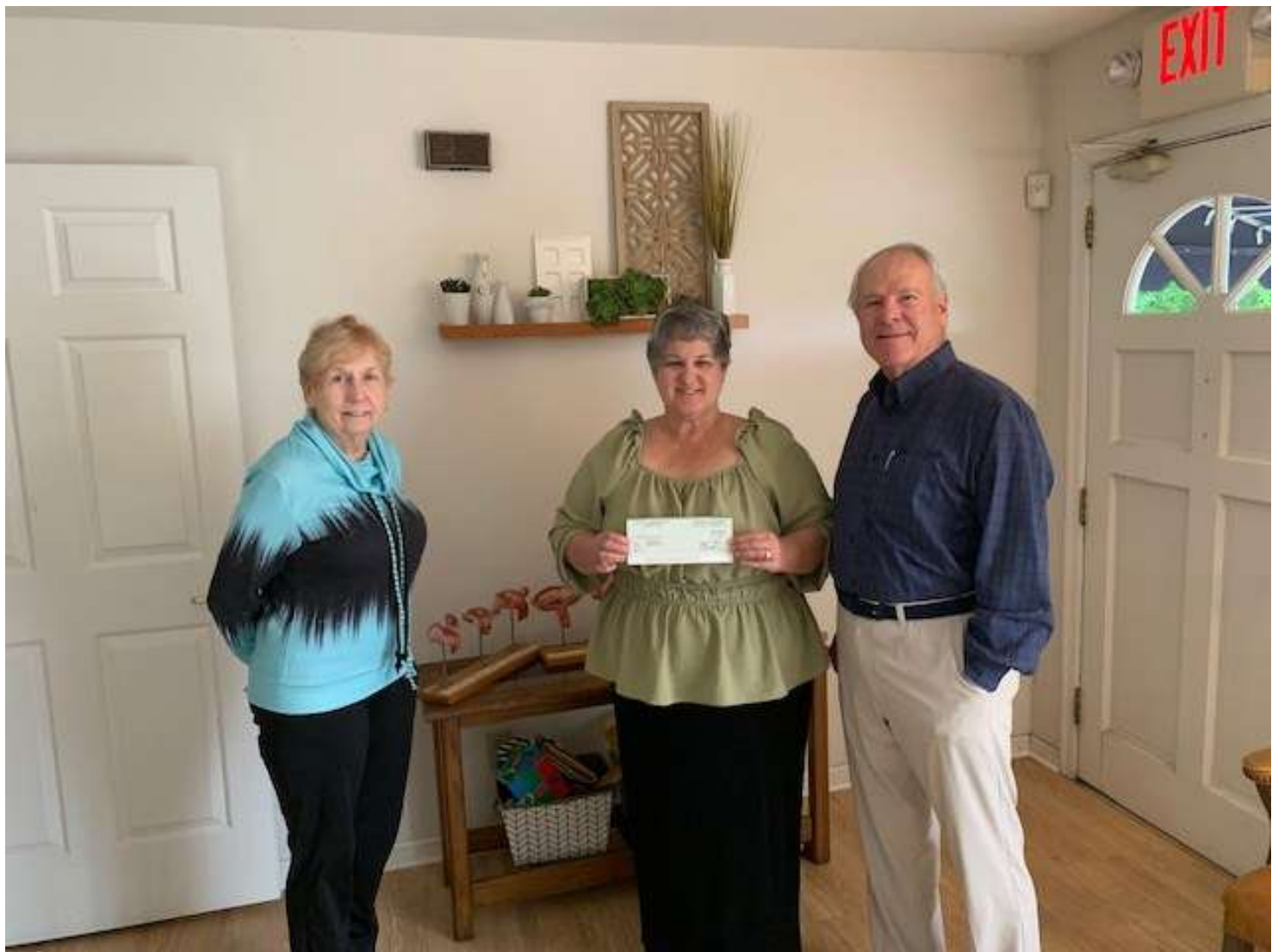




# BirthRight Check Presentation 10-01

# Ten Homeless Shelter Dates Need Volunteers

For many years, Council 11402 has participated in the All Saints Parish Homeless Shelter Management Program at the Bashor Homeless Mens Shelter co-located at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception Church and the adjacent Central Presbyterian Church. Only a gate separates the two properties and teams split between the two church facilities. The Shrine is located at 201 Washington Street SW, Atlanta 30303 downtown.

The Bashor Homeless Mens Shelter is a non-profit organization started in 1980 by an ecumenical group concerned about the growing problem of homelessness in Atlanta.

As a ministry of hospitality, it has evolved into a winter night shelter serving the needs of 90-100 homeless men in downtown Atlanta from November 1 through March 31. Open seven nights a week, the shelter provides guests with a hot meal, bagged lunch, and breakfast; showers; access to medical and foot care; and recreational activities such as yoga, basketball, and art.

Usually parish women donate, cook, and deliver meals to the shelter and then leave. The men make bag lunches, serve full evening meals, manage the homeless, sleep overnight, and provide morning bag lunches as the homeless depart.

Council 11402 will manage the overnight facilities on these dates:

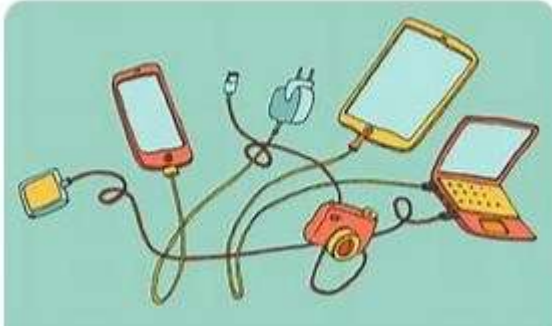

# Council Eyewear Recycling



Our brother Paul McNulty volunteers for the GA Lighthouse Association to recycle used eyewear of all types to that organization.

He will position a donation box in the knights hall to collect these items rather than throwing them away.

His message is below. Please bring old used eyewear and deposit it for recycling when you come to council meetings.

All eyewear goes through a three-step QA process and those that can be re-used (approx. 70%) are donated to mission groups that travel throughout the world providing glasses to the needy.

The glasses and pieces of eyewear that come in damaged, are then sent to a recycler for which GA Lighthouse receives monies to help operate their free eye testing clinic, which is staffed with a licensed volunteer Optometrist at the Chamblee clinic. As a part of this, clients can receive not only free testing but very low price or free glasses. if they qualify based on income.

They collect **Sun, Prescription, and Reading glasses** and know that many of us have multiple pairs of glasses that we no longer need. We either throw them away or keep them in a drawer.

We would like to ask, that the Brothers bring any unneeded eyewear to each & every council meeting, and we will provide a donation box and bring them to GA Lighthouse to help others in need of glasses.

Margaret Mary “Peggy” (Byrne) McCabe, 86, a beloved mother, grandmother, sister, and dear friend, passed away peacefully at her home in Dunwoody, Georgia on October 24, 2024. Born on October 9, 1938, in New York, Peggy never abandoned her big city roots while embracing her new Southern home upon her move to Atlanta in 1980.

Her early years include attending George Washington High School in Washington Heights, New York. Upon graduation, she worked for Blue Cross and Ingersoll Rand. She met her husband, Owen McCabe, during these years, who courted her for four years before they married in 1962.

Owen remained the sunshine and love of her life even after his passing in August of 2009.

Her legacy lives on through her cherished grandchildren who will always know that “Nana” loved them: Zach, Maddie, Grace, May, Sadie and Owen, and her grandchildren by marriage: Jack, Isabel and Piper.
