Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to proper procedures for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail works, Paying \$40 at a council meeting by cash, check, or by our "Square" credit card reader device works perfectly well also.

Those liking immediate remote gratification may use the instructions below. We no longer use PayPal. Now Zelle is the proper app to send \$40 electronically without fee. Our website can also handle credit cards electronically for \$41.50 (\$1.50 process fee).





Ten Homeless Shelter Dates Need Volunteers

For many years, Council 11402 has participated in the All Saints Parish Homeless Shelter Management Program at the Bashor Homeless Mens Shelter co-located at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception Church and the adjacent Central Presbyterian Church. Only a gate separates the two properties and teams split between the two church facilities. The Shrine is located at 201 Washington Street SW, Atlanta 30303 downtown.

The Bashor Homeless Mens Shelter is a non-profit organization started in 1980 by an ecumenical group concerned about the growing problem of homelessness in Atlanta.

As a ministry of hospitality, it has evolved into a winter night shelter serving the needs of 90-100 homeless men in downtown Atlanta from November 1 through March 31. Open seven nights a week, the shelter provides guests with a hot meal, bagged lunch, and breakfast; showers; access to medical and foot care; and recreational activities such as yoga, basketball, and art.

Usually parish women donate, cook, and deliver meals to the shelter and then leave. The men make bag lunches, serve full evening meals, manage the homeless, sleep overnight, and provide morning bag lunches as the homeless depart.

Knights of Columbus Exceeds \$100 Million in Priesthood, Religious Life Support

As Catholics in the U.S. wrapped up the annual National Vocation Awareness Week November 3-9, one of the world's largest Catholic fraternal organizations announced it has provided more than \$100 million to date to those seeking religious life.

In a Nov. 8 media release, the Knights of Columbus said that its local councils—which globally total over 16,800—have helped to donate more than \$100 million directly to seminarians, postulants, and novices.

That support is channeled through the Knights' <u>Refund Support Vocations Program</u> (RSVP), which was launched in 1981 as vocations in North America began to decline.

Through RSVP, every \$500 a local council provides to a seminarian or religious life aspirant is incentivized by a refund of \$100 to the council from the Knights' Supreme Council, up to \$400 for \$2,000 donated (or 4 religious aspirants). Our All Saints Council always sponsors 4 aspirants.

In addition, the local council must offer non-financial support through letters, personal visits to the seminary or religious residence, or invitations to attend council events.

The program works to form "strong and long-lasting bonds" to those seeking to dedicate their lives to the Church, and the Knights. Hopefully, aspirants then become Knights.

Donations to RSVP hit an all-time high last year, with more than 2,700 local councils contributing \$4.1 million, according to the Knights.

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly noted that the Knights' own founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, "almost had to leave seminary after his father's death because of the financial strain facing his family."

Kelly continued, "Thankfully the Bishop of Hartford stepped in and provided the necessary Scholarship that allowed McGivney to continue his studies at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore. Were it not for that financial support, the Knights of Columbus would not exist".

With seminary formation averaging as much as \$55,000 annually in some parts of the nation—and with many seminarians and religious life aspirants pursuing their vocations after incurring student loan debt for undergraduate degrees—initiatives such as RSVP have become increasingly vital.





Our brother Paul McNulty volunteers for the GA Lighthouse Association to recycle used eyewear of all types to that organization.

He will position a donation box in the knights hall to collect these items rather than throwing them away.

Vision Clin His message is below. Please bring old used eyewear and deposit it for recycling when you come to council meetings.

All eyewear goes through a three-step QA process and those that can be reused (approx. 70%) are donated to mission groups that travel throughout the world providing glasses to the needy.

The glasses and pieces of eyewear that come in damaged, are then sent to a recycler for which GA Lighthouse receives monies to help operate their free eye testing clinic, which is staffed with a licensed volunteer Optometrist at the Chamblee clinic. As a part of this, clients can receive not only free testing but very low price or free glasses. if they qualify based on income.


They collect Sun, Prescription, and Reading glasses and know that many of us have multiple pairs of glasses that we no longer need. We either throw them away or keep them in a drawer.






