Paying Council Dues Electronically

Members are a little confused as to proper procedures for paying dues electronically. Sending a check for \$40 by snail mail works, Paying \$40 at a council meeting by cash, check, or by our "Square" credit card reader device works perfectly well also.

Those liking immediate remote gratification may use the instructions below. We no longer use PayPal. Now Zelle is the proper app to send \$40 electronically without fee. Our website can also handle credit cards electronically for \$41.50 (\$1.50 process fee).

Regular Council 11402 dues for 2025 are \$40.

Our council website www.kc11402.org handles electronic payment of council dues by credit card as well.



All Saints Fish Frys New Record!!

It didn't take long for the Fish Fry records to start falling again.

Our Feb. 28th Practice Fry recorded a record 684 meals provided—an all —time <u>practice</u> meal record. All meals were \$8. The reduced price meant that complaints were not allowed.

Our March 7th fry recorded 1,342 meals. This was our second-biggest of all time.

Our March 14th fry recorded 1,267 meals. Still a top twenty number.

Our March 21st fry recorded 1,473 meals. An all-time record after 25 years.

Our March 28th fry recorded 1,217 meals. The beat goes on.

Our April 4th fry recorded 1,318 meals. Looks like a record year!

Our April 11th fry recorded 1,199 meals.

Our grand total was exactly 8,500 meals this year.

On March 24th, Fred and his contingent reserved a big table right up front in the gym and was greeted by the clergy and his brothers. Welcome home, Fred.





Our Sir Knight B.J. Van Gundy has painstakingly collected data on our Lenten Fish Frys from 2005 to 2025. Here is the graphical illustrations of the tremendous increasing success of our Fry events over the years.

This year was an all-time record with 8,500 meals. Please note how grew with "only" 4,645 meals in 2005. Earlier years are not recorded and the first Frys prior to 2005 were obviously very small as the events flourished.

Knight's Chapel Official Turnover


After months of construction, the <u>Our Lady, Queen of the Knights Chapel</u> was turned over to pastor Father Mike Silloway in a formal presentation. A sample check image of \$15,000 was awarded to Father for the construction and mold removal in that chapel and the surrounding areas.

The original chapel was built by the All Saints Knights in 1999 and presented to Monsignor Kiernan in a similar ceremony. (See next page.)

Special Knights of Columbus Edition

Our Lady, Queen of the Knights Chapel

Hidden in plain sight in the vestibule of All Saints Church is a interesting room with a small sign reading "Our Lady, Queen of the Knights Chapel." In a previous life, it was a gift shop, but its ultimate destiny was to become a chapel.

In late 1998, Monsignor Kiernan mentioned to All Saints Grand Knight George Novac that he would like to have a chapel similar to one that he had admired at Holy Spirit Parish. Brother Novac took our home-building Brother Sam Portis with him, and they checked out the Holy Spirit Chapel. They let Monsignor know that it would not be a problem, because it was constructed of American Cherry "judges paneling" with a light stain and lacquer found in many higher level homes.

It was decided that the gift shop would be converted, that the Knights would donate the labor and the room materials, and the church would pay for the air conditioning and electrical modifications. Novac would handle the administrative issues, Portis would handle the construction, and they took turns overseeing subcontractors as schedules permitted.

At this point, David Boring, the sales manager of the Pierce and Pierce Mill Works Company on Buford Highway, was contracted by Portis to supply the wood. (Boring was a Catholic and eager to help. Novac and Portis eventually persuaded Boring to become a Knight, and he later even helped start the Blue Ridge Council in North Georgia). Portis then contacted his trim man to design the paneling. Monsignor was shown the raw product samples at the mill supplier and approved the final design and "look" he wanted.

The project took about a month and went extremely well except for some heating/air conditioning problems. Another Knight, Bob Greene, volunteered his expertise with carpeting from his decorating business and also chose the colors. At that point, the question of furniture came up.

It was decided that they would start with twelve kneeler/chairs named in honor of the twelve apostles. That brought yet another Knight into the picture. Dick Holcomb (now with St. Brigid Council) was a neighbor of Sam Portis and sold that type of furniture. After some cajoling by Portis, he agreed to sell the kneeler/chairs at a discount to the church. Portis, Novac, and Holcomb generously each paid personally for one unit and nine other parishioners bought one also. The dedication plaques are on the chairs still.

The chapel was dedicated and blessed by Archbishop Donoghue and Monsignor on Feb, 8, 1999. Today it is used for smaller baptisms, benedictions, prayer and silent meditation, and other limited functions. With the twelve apostle chairs and a few others, the room should only accommodate about 15 people maximum.

Using the people, techniques, and talents that were so successful on the chapel project, the Knights then turned their efforts toward converting the cluttered storage area in the basement under the Kiernan Scout Hut into the present beautiful McGivney Hall, named after Fr. Michael J. McGivney who founded the **Knights of Columbus** in 1882. Thus, two underserved areas became very functional additions to the parish because of this hard-working organization.

Gold Shield Foundation Award

At our April 1st council meeting, we were honored to have Kurt Oppermann, the President of the Gold Shield Foundation, as a guest speaker. He was brought by our Sir Knight Bob Mitchell who has been a champion of that organization.

- Our \$1,500 donation will serve to further provide immediate financial assistance and insure a college education or vocational training for the spouse and dependent children of law enforcement officers and firefighters killed in the line of duty.

Council Eyewear Recycling







Our brother Paul McNulty volunteers for the GA Lighthouse Association to recycle used eyewear of all types to that organization.

He will position a donation box in the knights hall to collect these items rather than throwing them away.

Vision Clin His message is below. Please bring old used eyewear and deposit it for recycling when you come to council meetings.

All eyewear goes through a three-step QA process and those that can be reused (approx. 70%) are donated to mission groups that travel throughout the world providing glasses to the needy.

The glasses and pieces of eyewear that come in damaged, are then sent to a recycler for which GA Lighthouse receives monies to help operate their free eye testing clinic, which is staffed with a licensed volunteer Optometrist at the Chamblee clinic. As a part of this, clients can receive not only free testing but very low price or free glasses. if they qualify based on income.

Who Put "under God" into Pledge

Most Knights are unaware that the KofC was the group that started the movement to add the words "under God" into the Pledge of Allegiance in 1951. Other groups joined and President Eisenhower signed the bill on Flag Day in June of 1954. Be Proud, Brothers! Now we are fighting to keep it there.

I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

How the words "UNDER GOD" came to be added to the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States originated on Columbus Day, 1893. It contained no reference to Almighty God, until in New York City on April 22, 1951, the Board of Directors of the Knights of Columbus adopted a resolution to amend the Pledge of Allegiance as recited at the opening of each of the meetings of the 800 Fourth Degree Assemblies of the Knights of Columbus by the addition of the words "under God" after the words "one nation". The adoption of this resolve by the Supreme Board of Directors had the effect of an immediate initiation of this practice throughout the aforesaid Fourth Degree Assembly meetings.

At their annual State Meetings, held in April and May of 1952, the State Councils of Florida, South Dakota, New York and Michigan adopted resolutions recommending that the Pledge of Allegiance be so amended and that Congress be petitioned to have such amendment made effective.

On August 21, 1952, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus, at its annual meeting, adopted a resolution urging that the change be made general and copies of this resolution were sent to the President, the Vice President (as Presiding Officer of the Senate) and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The National Fraternal Congress meeting in Boston on September 24, 1952, adopted a similar resolution upon the recommendation of its President, Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart. Several State Fraternal Congresses acted likewise almost immediately thereafter.

At its annual meeting the following year, on August 20, 1953, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus repeated its resolution to make this amendment to the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag general and to send copies of this resolve to the President, Vice President, Speaker of the House, and to each member of both Houses of Congress. From this latter action, many favorable replies were received, and a total of seventeen resolutions were introduced in the House of Representatives to so amend the Pledge of Allegiance as set forth in the Public Law relating to the use of the flag. The resolution introduced by Congressman Louis C. Rabaut of Michigan was adopted by both Houses of Congress, and it was signed by President Eisenhower on Flag Day, June 14, 1954, thereby making official the amendment conceived, sponsored, and put into practice by the Knights of Columbus more than three years before.

In a message to Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart at the meeting of the Supreme Council in Louisville, August 17, 1954, President Eisenhower, in recognition of the initiative of the Knights of Columbus in originating and sponsoring the amendment to the Pledge of Allegiance, said:

"We are particularly thankful to you for your part in the movement to have the words 'under God' added to our Pledge of Allegiance. These words will remind Americans that despite our great physical strength we must remain humble. They will help us to keep constantly in our minds and hearts the spiritual and moral principles which alone give dignity to man, and upon which our way of life is founded. For the contribution which your organization has made to this cause, we must be genuinely grateful."

In August, 1954, the Illinois American Legion Convention adopted a resolution whereby recognition was given to the Knights of Columbus as having initiated, sponsored and brought about the amendment to the Pledge of Allegiance; and on October 6, 1954, the National Executive Committee of the American Legion gave its approval to that resolution.



Brother Bernard D. Marino, 91, Has Passed



Bernie was born in Manhattan, NY, the son of Vito and Amelia Marino and brother to Lorraine and Donald. He earned his bachelor's degree from Manhattan College and his MBA from New York University.

After meeting Florence at a church dance in 1954, Bernie soon took her on their first date to the Winter Garden Theater on Broadway. He returned home to New York after completing two years of service in the United States Army and nine days later he married the love of his life, Florence, in October 1958. The couple eventually settled in Dunwoody, Georgia raising their family and enjoyed being married for nearly 65 years. Florence died in June 2024 and Bernie missed his bride dearly.

Bernie led a very full life. After college he had several financial positions with Fortune 500 companies, including the role of CFO. His career took his family all over the country. He then cofounded Management Campus Institute, a management consulting firm. Starting a new business during the 1970's recession was not an easy feat: nevertheless, they persevered and succeeded. Eventually, Bernie started his own business, Resource Management Consultants. His extensive client list was filled with Fortune 500 companies, mid-cap organizations and family-owned businesses taking him all over the world. One of his corporate positions was with Pepsi Cola and later Coca Cola became one of his main clients.

His varied experience and deep knowledge led him to write and publish the Handbook of Capital Expenditure Management. Not only did he enjoy consulting with professionals, he also taught his children and grandchildren sound financial management skills. Bernie never officially retired as he continued to dabble in his career until he was 90. His youthful appearance, excellent physical condition and sharp mind allowed him to do so. Quite simply, Bernie was a financial guru. There was always a Barron's or a Wall Street Journal on the kitchen table. He was driven to understand the stock market and always had his eye on his next stock trade.

Dubbed "Mr. Baseball", Bernie's passion for the game developed as a young boy watching the Yankees play at Yankee stadium near his boyhood home. As a devoted Braves fan, he became the President of the Atlanta Braves Fans Club. His Braves and Yankees memorabilia collection is impressive, and he never grew tired of watching games and talking baseball. Bernie was a founding member of All Saints Catholic Church. He was actively involved serving the Knights of Columbus, Saint Vincent de Paul, Pallbearer ministry and a Eucharistic Minister and Acolyte. A very compassionate and giving man, he assisted numerous charities including St. Labre Indian School and The Missionary Sisters of St. Benedict.

Wanting to preserve the small-town feel of Dunwoody and help manage growth, Bernie was President of Dunwoody Homeowners Association for many years in the 1970s and 1980s. Bernie was instrumental in keeping the Williamsburg style of Dunwoody Village; convincing business owners to not use neon signs; and reaching an agreement with Pizza Hut to open the Dunwoody Pizza Hut without a red roof, the only one in the nation.

With a deep fondness for music and dance, Bernie was also on the board of the Dunwoody Stage Door Players. He had a passion for travel, visiting numerous countries with his late wife. At the age 91, he had trips planned to Sicily, New Orleans, French Polynesia and who knows where else.

Bernie is proceeded in death by his parents, Vito and Amelia Marino, wife Florence Marino and brother Donald Marino.

Bernard is survived by his loving family of five children, Mary Harrison (Ray Goff), Bernie Marino (Jill Marino), Beth Marino, Stephanie Marino (Rich Ramires), and Stacy Marino (Larry Towner).
